**Fall Sermon Series: Daniel: Unshakeable:
Faith and Resilience in the Already/Not Yet Kingdom**

Title: *Leave and Lean*

Preacher: The Rev. Alfred T.K. Zadig, Jr.

As we come to our second sermon in our preaching series on the prophet Daniel, Daniel is ordered out of Israel and sent into the dark and corrupt land of Babylon. There, Daniel leaves and leans. He leaves the natural behind to lean on the supernatural, as he, through the power of God, successfully interprets the dream of King Nebuchadnezzar. This alone is a wake up call to all of us. As humans, we have such a proclivity to lean on our own natural understanding instead of the supernatural revelation of God. Lord forgive us! 

The Scriptures teach that much of our spiritual renewal is by the washing of the Word of God, which cleanses our minds and purifies our hearts.

In the **Confession of Sin and Absolution**, our sins, both individual and corporate, have been confessed, and we have been powerfully reassured of God's complete forgiveness through Jesus Christ. We begin with a cleansing admission and confession of sin followed by an authoritative pronouncement of God's forgiveness in Christ Jesus. This is always "ground zero" for Christians. We move out from here.

Presentation:

In the early Church people were often given new names when baptized to further symbolize the transforming of their lives through Jesus Christ. For example, Saul became Paul when his heart was converted to the love of Jesus, The Christ.

The Candidate(s) and Sponsors stand before the altar rail, where the Candidates are presented by name. The Celebrant asks the Candidates six questions known down through the centuries as The Three Great Renunciations, followed by The Three Great Affirmations.

Baptismal Covenant:

Simply the Creed in Q & A form where we proactively renew our belief and submit our lives to Jesus Christ.

Officiant Dearly beloved, Scripture teaches that we were all dead in our sins and trespasses, but by grace we may be saved through faith. Our Savior Jesus Christ said, "Unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God"; and he commissioned the Church to "make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." Here we ask our heavenly Father that this candidate, being baptized with water, may be filled with the Holy Spirit, born again, and received into the Church as a living member of Christ's body. Therefore, I urge you to call upon God the Father, through our Lord Jesus Christ, that of his abundant mercy he will grant to this child that which by nature he cannot have.

Celebrant The Candidate for Holy Baptism will now be presented.

Parents & Godparents:

I present David Carroll Carter, Jr. to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

Celebrant Today, on behalf of this child, you shall make vows to renounce the devil and all his works, to trust God wholeheartedly, and to serve him faithfully. It is your task to see that he is taught, as soon as he is able to learn, the meaning of all these vows, and of the Faith that you will profess as revealed in the Holy Scriptures. He must come to put his faith in Jesus Christ, and learn the Creeds, the Lord's Prayer, the Ten Commandments, and all other things that a Christian ought to know, believe, and do for the welfare of their soul. When he has embraced all these, he is to come to the Bishop to be confirmed, that he may publicly claim the Faith for his own and be further strengthened by the Holy Spirit to serve Christ and his kingdom.

Celebrant Are you willing and ready to undertake this?

Parents & Sponsors ***I am, the Lord being my helper.***

The Celebrant asks the following questions of the parents and sponsors of the candidates.

Question Do you renounce the devil and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God?

Answer ***I renounce them.***

Question Do you renounce the empty promises and deadly deceits of this world that corrupt and destroy the creatures of God?

Answer ***I renounce them.***

Question Do you renounce the sinful desires of the flesh that draw you from the love of God?

Answer ***I renounce them.***

Celebrant Almighty God deliver you from the powers of darkness and evil, and lead you into the light and obedience of the kingdom of his Son Jesus Christ our Lord. ***Amen.***

Question Do you turn to Jesus Christ and confess him as your Lord and Savior?

Answer ***I do.***

Question Do you joyfully receive the Christian Faith, as revealed in the Holy Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments?

Answer *I do.*

Question Will you obediently keep God's holy will and commandments, and walk in them all the days of your life?

Answer *I will, the Lord being my helper.*

Then the Celebrant addresses the congregation, saying,

Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support this child in his life in Christ?

People *We will.*

Celebrant Standing, let us join with this Candidate to proclaim our faith in the words of the ancient baptismal confession, the Apostle's Creed.

Officiant Do you believe and trust in God the Father?

People *I do. I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.*

Officiant Do you believe and trust in Jesus Christ?

People *I do. I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.*

Officiant Do you believe and trust in the Holy Spirit?

People *I do. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.*

Celebrant Let us now pray for Duke to receive the Sacrament of Baptism. The parents and sponsors will lead us in the prayers.

Leader That Duke may continue in the apostles' teaching and the fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers.

People *We beseech you to hear us, Good Lord.*

Leader That Duke may walk in a manner worthy of the calling to which he has been called, ever growing in faith and all heavenly virtues.

People *We beseech you to hear us, Good Lord.*

Leader That Duke may persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever he falls into sin, repent and return to the Lord.

People *We beseech you to hear us, Good Lord.*

Leader That Duke may proclaim by word and deed the Good News of God in Christ Jesus to a lost and broken world.

People *We beseech you to hear us, Good Lord.*

Leader That as living members of the Body of Christ, Duke may grow up in every way into him who is the head.

People *We beseech you to hear us, Good Lord.*

Leader That, looking to Jesus, Duke may run with endurance the race set before him, and at the last receive the unfading crown of glory.

People *We beseech you to hear us, Good Lord.*

Officiant Let us pray. Almighty and everlasting Father, in your great mercy you saved Noah and his family in the Ark from the destruction of the flood, pointing to the Sacrament of Holy Baptism. Look mercifully upon these your servants. Wash and sanctify them through your Holy Spirit, that they may be delivered from destruction and into the Ark of Christ's Church; and being steadfast in faith, joyful through hope, and rooted in love, they may pass through the turbulent floods of this troublesome world and come into the land of everlasting life, through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Celebrant Lift up your hearts.

People *We lift them up to the Lord.*

Celebrant Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People *It is right to give him thanks and praise.*

Celebrant says the prayer of blessing over the water and baptizes the candidate

Celebrant We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water. Over water the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through water you led the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In water your Son Jesus received the baptism of John in the River Jordan when the Holy Spirit descended upon him as a dove.

We thank you, Father, for the water of Baptism. In water we are buried with Christ in his death. By water we share in his resurrection. Through water we are born again by the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Now, Father, sanctify this water by the power of your Holy Spirit. May all who are baptized here be cleansed from sin, be born again, and continue for ever faithful in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior. To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory, now and for ever. **Amen.**

Celebrant **David Carroll Carter, Jr.**, I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

Then the Celebrant places a hand on the person's head, marking on the forehead the sign of the cross and saying

You are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever. **Amen.**

**Baptism is the Beginning,
not the End**

Baptism is but a "pilot light" that effects little in life if not fueled and fed. Next step: Bring this child back next Sunday for worship and continued forming in faith, so that in years to come, he or she will have the tools to publicly confess their faith through confirmation (Parents, this means you are their chief teachers about Jesus-Deuteronomy 6). So, Baptism simply marks the beginning of a journey.

When all have been baptized and signed, the Celebrant says

Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon this your servant the forgiveness of sin, received him as your own child by adoption, made him a member of your holy Church, and raised him to the new life of grace. Sustain him, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit, that he may enjoy everlasting salvation through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Baptismal Blessing Song: *God bless dear Duke, and keep him safe in your arms.*

The Celebrant, Candidates, and Sponsors return to the altar rail and the Celebrant says
Let us welcome the newly baptized.

Celebrant and People

We receive you into the fellowship of the Church. Confess the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection, and share with us in the royal priesthood of all his people.

The Peace, standing

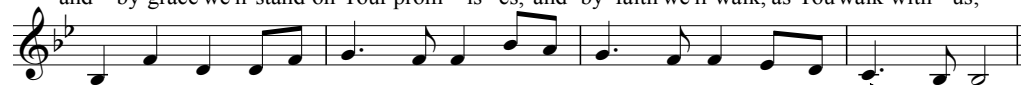

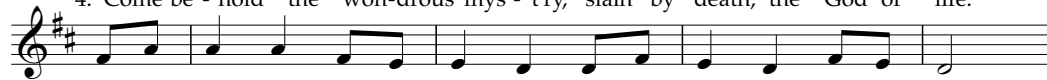

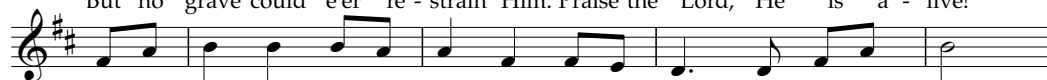

The Lord's Prayer, so called because Jesus gave this prayer to His disciples as an example of how to pray, has been a part of Eucharistic liturgies since year 400 A.D. The link between our daily bread and the spiritual food we receive in the Eucharist is very ancient. In the Lord's Prayer, we ask for daily bread, meaning the things we need to get through each day. But as a part of that, the sacramental bread also symbolizes God's presence, which is something that is also essential to our getting through the day.

During Communion:

When we gather together, we remember the presence of Jesus. By repeating the words and actions of Jesus' last meal with His disciples, we join the story and make it our own. We don't just watch the drama or listen to it unfold, we enter into the story as we, too, take the bread and wine and eat and drink.

As you approach the rail, you may choose to receive the bread and wine from the cup at the rail, or indicate you want a mini-chalice by placing your right hand over your heart. Please consume the elements in the mini-chalice at the altar rail.

* Gluten Free Wafers are Available:

If you need a gluten free wafer, please indicate this at the altar rail by placing your hand over your heart.

Those at the rail will receive the bread in their hands, eat the bread, and then guide the chalice to their lips for a sip of the wine.





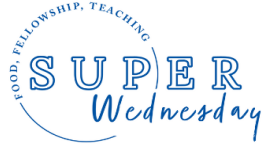
