The Old Testament: books

Pentateuch (Genesis – Deuteronomy): The firstbooks written by, also are called the books of the law
Historical Books (Joshua – Esther): The next books record the history of God's chosen people including the establishment of the kingdom of Israel, Israel's repeated turning from God to sin, God's punishment, Israel's repentance and God's gracious restoration.
Poetry (Job – Song of Solomon): Of the next books, Psalms—the Hebrew hymn book is probably the best known.
Major Prophets (Isaiah – Daniel): There are major prophets, they foretold the coming of Messiah but more often forth-told the word of God in terms of the impending disaster if Israel would not repent.
Minor Prophets (Hosea – Malachi): There are minor prophets. They are called minor only because they are shorter, not because they are less important.

♦ can be divided into five parts.

- Gospels (Matthew John). The first four books of the New Testament tell of Christ's life and ministry.
- History. The book of Acts, written as a follow-up to Luke's Gospel, tells the history of the early church.
- Pauline Epistles and Hebrews (Romans Hebrews) The next 13 books were epistles (letters) written by Paul (Hebrews is not identified, but many believe it was written by Paul). They are all named for the church or specific person to whom they were sent.
- General Epistles (James Jude). These are seven general epistles which were not written to any specific audience and so they are named not for the recipients but for the authors.
- **Prophecy**: The final book of the Bible, Revelation, is a prophetic book written to comfort Christians by describing the end times and the triumph of Christ.

WHAT BENEFITS DOES BAPTISM GIVE?

It works forgiveness of sins, rescues from death and the devil, and gives eternal salvation to all who believe this, as the words and promises of God declare.

Which are these words and promises of God?

Christ our Lord says in the last chapter of Mark: "Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved, but whoever does not believe will be condemned." (Mark 16:16)

HOW CAN WATER DO SUCH GREAT THINGS?

Certainly not just water, but the word of God in and with the water does these things, along with the faith which trusts this word of God in the water. For without God's word the water is plain water and no Baptism. But with the word of God it is a Baptism, that is, a life-giving water, rich in grace, and a washing of the new birth in the Holy Spirit, as St. Paul says in Titus, chapter three: "He saved us through the washing of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit, whom He poured out on us generously through Jesus Christ our Savior, so that, having been justified by His grace, we might become heirs having the hope of eternal life. This is a trustworthy saying." Titus 3:5–8

What does such baptizing with water indicate?

It indicates that the Old Adam in us should by daily contrition and repentance be drowned and die with all sins and evil desires, and that a new man should daily emerge and arise to live before God in righteousness and purity forever.

Where is this written?

St. Paul writes in Romans chapter six: "We were therefore buried with Him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life." Romans. 6:4



WORD and SACRAMENT

(Sacrament of the Altar)

WHAT IS THE SACRMENTO OF THE ALTAR

It is the true body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the bread and wine, instituted by Christ Himself for us Christians to eat and to drink.

WHERE IS THIS WRITTEN?

The holy Evangelists Matthew, Mark, Luke, and St Paul write:

Our Lord Jesus Christ, on the night when He was betrayed, took bread, and when He had given thanks, He broke it and gave it to the disciples and said: "Take, eat; this is My body, which is given for you. This do in remembrance of Me."

In the same way also He took the cup after supper, and when He had given thanks, He gave it to them, saying, "Drink of it, all of you; this cup is the new testament in My blood, which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me."

WHAT IS THE BENEFIT OF THIS EATING AND DRINKING?

These words, "Given and shed for you for the forgiveness of sins," show us that in the Sacrament forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation are given us through these words. For where there is forgiveness of sins, there is also life and salvation. How can bodily eating and drinking do such great things? Certainly not just eating and drinking do these things, but the words written here: "Given and shed for you for the forgiveness of sins." These words, along with the bodily eating and drinking, are the main thing in the Sacrament. Whoever believes these words has exactly what they say: "forgiveness of sins."

WHO RECEIVES THIS SACRAMENT WORTHILY?

Fasting and bodily preparation are certainly fine outward training. But that person is truly worthy and well prepared who has faith in these words: "Given and shed for you for the forgiveness of sins." But anyone who does not believe these words or doubts them is unworthy and unprepared, for the words "for you" require all hearts to believe.

WHA	AT IS THE OFFICE OF THE KEYS
	The Office of the Keys is that special authority which Christ has given to His church on earth to forgive the sins of repentant sinners, but to withhold forgiveness from the unrepentant as long as they do not repent.
	The Lord Jesus breathed on His disciples and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive anyone his sins, they are forgiven; if you do not forgive them, they are not forgiven." (John 20:22–23)
Who	se Sins Are Forgiven?
	Sinners who, who are sorry for their sins, confess to God, and ask forgiveness receive forgiveness. Because of Christ their sins is completely forgiveness.
Who	se Sins are Not Forgiven?.
	The sinner. Absolution is withheld in order to bring the sinner back to repentance, forgiveness and fellowship.

Ten Commandments

The First Commandment

You shall have no other gods.

What does this mean? We should fear, love, and trust in God above all things.

The Second Commandment

You shall not misuse the name of the LORD your God.

What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not curse, swear, use satanic arts, lie, or deceive by His name, but call upon it in every trouble, pray, praise, and give thanks.

The Third Commandment

Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy.

What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not despise preaching and His Word, but hold it sacred and gladly hear and learn it.

The Fourth Commandment

Honor your father and your mother.

What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not despise or anger our parents and other authorities, but honor them, serve and obey them, love and cherish them.

The Fifth Commandment

You shall not murder.

What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not hurt or harm our neighbor in his body, but help and support him in every physical need.

The Sixth Commandment

You shall not commit adultery.

What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we lead a sexually pure and decent life in what we say and do, and husband and wife love and honor each other.

The Seventh Commandment

You shall not steal.

What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not take our neighbor's money or possessions, or get them in any dishonest way, but help him to improve and protect his possessions and income.

The Eighth Commandment

You shall not give false testimony against your neighbor.

What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not tell lies about our neighbor, betray him, slander him, or hurt his reputation, but defend him, speak well of him, and explain everything in the kindest way.

The Ninth Commandment

You shall not covet your neighbor's house.

What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not scheme to get our neighbor's inheritance or house, or get it in a way which only appears right, but help and be of service to him in keeping it.

The Tenth Commandment

You shall not covet your neighbor's wife, or his manservant or maidservant, his ox or donkey, or anything that belongs to your neighbor.

What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not entice or force away our neighbor's wife, workers, or animals, or turn them against him, but urge them to stay and do their duty.

While I know I don't have all the answers, I'm ready to talk to anyone about Jesus and His Lordship in my life.

My Confirmation says we should not be ashamed of the Gospel. I am not ashamed! I am not ashamed of who I am in Jesus. I have been baptized into Christ and I am proud to be called a Christian. To be a Christian means you shouldn't be ashamed to be associated with Him, believe in Him and live for Him. My goal is to live my life proudly for Jesus Christ. I know at times this will be hard because there is so much pressure to live selfishly like most people in the world. But I know that with my God's help I can learn to live more like him every day especially as I grow in my faith. I know God will help me with this and that's good news too.
