## Happy Easter!

On April 9th it is Easter Sunday and with resounding "Alleluias!" we will celebrate the resurrection of Christ. In this part of the world and at this time of the year the weather seasons match up well with the seasons of the Church Year. Winters can be long and cold and dark. It is always a great relief when we enter spring and enjoy more sunlight, warmth, and start to see things coming back to life again. In the church we experience something similar as the sombreness of the season of Lent gives way to the hope and joy of Easter.

The hope and joy of Easter are founded on and secured by Jesus through His sin-forgiving and death-defeating resurrection. Everything we believe, teach and confess about God's promise of salvation hinges on Jesus' resurrection. In his letter to the Corinthians, St. Paul said, "For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures, that He was buried, that He was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures, and that He appeared to Cephas, then to the

twelve" (1 Corinthians 15:3-5).

When St. Paul repeats that Jesus died for our sins and was raised on the

third day "in accordance with the Scriptures," he is emphasizing that Jesus fulfilled what was prophesied in the Old Testament about the promised Messiah. This is also true when we confess in the Nicene Creed "And the third day He rose again according to the Scriptures" it means that we confess with St. Paul that Jesus rose just as the ancient prophecies in Holy Scripture said He would. If Jesus didn't rise from the dead then those prophecies were not fulfilled and we are dead in our trespasses. St. Paul teaches this bluntly, "...if Christ has not been raised from the dead, then our preaching is in vain and your faith is in vain" (1 Corinthians

Then St. Paul teaches boldly, "But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep" (1



Corinthians 15:20). It's a fact that was attested to when Jesus appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve, and then to hundreds more. Because of the fact of Jesus' resurrection St. Paul teaches, "For as by one man came death, by a man has come also the resurrection of the dead. For as in Adam all die, so also in Christ shall all be made alive" (1 Corinthians 15:21-22).

Dear baptized child of God, you are made alive in Christ and His resurrection secures your own resurrection to life everlasting. This is what St. Paul was talking about when he reminds us of what is of first importance—it is the gospel which we have received, in which we stand, and by which we are being saved. Happy Easter!


*Tapestry* is a publication of Lutheran Women's Missionary League–Canada (LWMLC). While it is national in scope, it is edited and prepared for

#### GOOD NEWS: CHRIST IS RISEN! HE IS RISEN INDEED!

"Now I would remind you, brothers [and sisters], of the gospel I preached to you, which you received, in which you stand, and by which you are being saved, if you hold fast to the word I preached to you—unless you believed in vain. For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures, that He was buried, that He was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures, and that He appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve. Then He appeared to more than five hundred brothers at one time, most of whom are still alive, though some have fallen asleep. Then He appeared to James, then to all the apostles. Last of all, as to one untimely born, He appeared also to me. For I am the least of the apostles, unworthy to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God. But by the grace of God I am what I am, and His grace toward me was not in vain. On the contrary, I worked harder

than any of them, though it was not I, but the grace of God that is with me. Whether then it was I or they, so we preach and so you believed. (1 Corinthians 15:1-11 ESV)

In this, his first letter to the Corinthians, St. Paul wanted them (and us) to know that the good news of the Scriptures that was being preached is true. Apostles had witnessed Jesus' suffering and death on the cross, and found His tomb empty three days later. After His resurrection, Jesus had appeared to hundreds of people. Than, after His ascension into heaven, Jesus had made Himself known to Paul on the road to Damascus, and Paul's life had been changed forever.

"If in Christ we have hope in this life only, we are of all people most to be pitied. But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep. For as by a man came death, by a man has come also the resurrection of the dead. For as in Adam all die, so also in Christ shall all be made alive. But each in his own order: Christ the firstfruits, then at His coming those who belong to Christ. Then comes the end, when He delivers the kingdom to God the Father after destroying every rule and every authority and power. For He must reign until He has put all His enemies under His feet. The last enemy to be destroyed is death." (1 Corinthians 15:19-26 ESV)

Christ's resurrection has eternal

consequences for all who put our trust in Him. Not only does it confirm the victory He won for us, but it assures us that our bodies will be raised to life at His second coming.

"Whoever believes in the Son has eternal life; whoever does not obey the Son shall not see life, but the wrath of God remains on him." (John 3:36 ESV)

These words of Jesus remind us that it is only through faith in Him that we will experience eternal life. Everyone who has died in unbelief remains condemned by sin and its eternal consequences. How important it is for us to share

the good news of Christ with family, friends and neighbours!

If you plan to participate in the Easter Cross witness, please remember to display the plain side of your cross beginning on Palm Sunday (April 2) until turning it to display "He is Risen" on Easter Sunday (April 9) and throughout the week that follows.

#### Stewardship

Stewardship is not just about giving money to the church. It includes this, to be sure, but it is not limited to it. Stewardship involves our whole life – everything we have and everything we are.

Let us not, though, fall into the trap of thinking that because we give of ourselves in one area we can neglect giving in another. Stewardship is not stealing from Peter to pay Paul. It is not a game we play whereby we justify ourselves in not giving a tenth of our income because we have given in some other way. This is why our Lord warns:

"Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! For you tithe mint and dill and cumin, and have neglected the weightier matters of the law: justice and mercy and faithfulness. These you ought to have done, without neglecting the others." (Matthew 23:23)

We are given to do both – tithe of ourselves and what we have. And so it is that St. Paul makes his appeal to us:

"I appeal to you therefore, brothers, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship. Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that by testing you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect." (Romans 12:1-2)

We are to present our bodies as a living sacrifice to God. We are not to have the mind of the world, where we exchange equal weight of this for an equal weight of that, and then think that we have done what God has required.

Our whole life is given over for service in and for the Church of God. This is to be done in thanksgiving for what God in Christ has accomplished for us. This is our spiritual worship, the reasonable response to what He has done for us – not one for the other, but all in all.

But what does this look like? St. Paul never lays down a general principle without also giving us some practical application of what shape that principle is to take concretely. He gives the general principle that our bodies are to be living sacrifices to God, and, after admonishing those who have been given particular gifts of grace to serve the church, St. Paul then

speaks generally of what is expected of all. He says:

"Let love be genuine. Abhor what is evil; hold fast to what is good. Love one another with brotherly affection. Outdo one another in showing honor. Do not be slothful in zeal, be fervent in spirit, serve the Lord. Rejoice in hope, be patient in tribulation, be constant in prayer. Contribute to the needs of the saints and seek to show hospitality." (Romans 12:9-13)

This is what it looks like to present your bodies as living sacrifices. This is how we live out the grace of God here in time.

Let us then heed the apostle's teaching. Let us present our bodies – everything that we have and everything that we are – as living sacrifices to God, our reasonable response to what God in Christ Jesus accomplished for us by His death and resurrection.

Through this we have forgiveness of sins, a new life in Christ, and eternal salvation. And through this worship, the grace of God is made manifest in His saints – for the church and the world.

had quite a few followers by then. He healed many of their illnesses and they thought He would make a great leader, but the people who were the leaders didn't like Him very

much. Anyway, there's lots of people shouting and singing for joy while waving palm branches as Jesus goes by! Even though He was happy to see their excitement, He knew it would not last. By Good Friday, which we'll be honouring in our church on April 7, they're angry with Him because the leaders convinced them He had done something wrong. He did not. Here are some questions to help us better understand what Jesus went through. Looking up the Bible readings will help too!

- What is the worst pain you have ever had?
- Which is worse, pain in your heart or pain felt in your body?
- · Did Jesus have only body

- pain or did He have pain in His heart, too? Why?
- How much do you think it hurt to have nails put through Jesus' hands and feet? (John 20:24-27)
- Do you think it hurt Jesus to have His friends turn away from Him? (Matthew 26:56)
- Did Jesus deserve to be punished like this? (2 Corinthians 5:21)
- Why did Jesus do it? (John 3:16)

"For God so loved the world that He gave His only Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life."

 What did Jesus say about those who killed Him? (Luke 23:34) Who does this?!! No one, but Jesus, the Son of God and Son of Man, that's who! Only His love is this perfect that He would give up His own life in the most humiliating way possible, so we can have our sins forgiven and live with Him some day in heaven! HAPPY EASTER!

#### What you will need:

- 2 paper plates
- black paper
- yellow paper
- 2 craft pins
- paper and pencils to decorate an Easter egg
- scissors
- glue

#### What to do:

- 1. Cut out the light from the yellow paper and glue it to the first plate.
- 2. Cut out the cross from the black paper and glue it over the light.
- 3. Draw and decorate an Easter egg and glue it on the second plate.
- 4. Cut the plate down the middle.
- 5. Attach with pins to the first plate so that it slides open.

You could choose to add a Bible verse to the plates.
