GROWING HEARTS OF FAITH

One Lord, One faith, One baptism (Ephesians 4:5)

Hey Kids!

Enjoy learning about some special Sundays in the church year — Ascension, Pentecost and The Holy Trinity!

What Is the Ascension? (May 29)

The Ascension is like the big goodbye—but in a happy way! After Jesus came back to life on Easter, He spent 40 days with His friends, His disciples, teaching them and showing them He was really alive. Then, one day, He took them to a hill and promised them something amazing: He would always be with them, and He would send the Holy Spirit to help them.

After that, Jesus went up to heaven! That's what "Ascension" means—going up. Imagine Jesus being lifted high into the sky, disappearing into the clouds. The disciples were amazed, but angels appeared and told them, "Don't worry! Jesus will come back one day." The Ascension reminds us that Jesus is always with us, even if we can't see Him.

What Is Pentecost? (June 8)

Pentecost is like a birthday party for the church! Ten days after Jesus went up to heaven, His friends were together in one place, praying and waiting for the special helper Jesus promised—the Holy Spirit.

Then, something amazing happened! There was a sound like a big, rushing wind, and little flames—like candles—appeared above their

heads. But no one got burned! Instead, the Holy Spirit filled them with power, and they started speaking in different languages so they could tell people from all over the world about Jesus.

This day, called Pentecost, reminds us that the Holy Spirit is with us, giving us courage, helping us learn, and sharing God's love with others. It's often called the day the church began, so it's a very special celebration.

What Is the Holy Trinity? (June 15)

The Holy Trinity is a little tricky to understand, but think of it like this: It's one God in three persons—Father, Son (Jesus), and Holy Spirit. It's like an apple! An apple has three parts: the skin, the flesh, and the seeds. All three are part of the same apple, just like the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are all God.

The Father is the creator—He made everything! The Son, Jesus, is the one who came to earth to save us. The Holy Spirit is the helper who lives in our hearts, guiding us and helping us grow in faith.

The Holy Trinity shows us that God is always with us in many ways, loving us and taking care of us. It's a reminder of how amazing and big God is!

STEWARDSHIP

STEWARDSHIP IN THE BODY OF CHRIST

Baseball season is upon us. The southern images of spring training give way to the pageantry of Opening Day. On that day, the hopes and dreams of every major league team, player and fan focus on doing whatever it takes to get to the Fall Classic, the World Series. Baseball is a secular way that so many of us confess that hope “springs” eternal.

With all of this in mind, baseball can also teach us a new perspective about stewardship. Think about the game itself. Baseball is a team sport. The home team faces off against the visitors. Yet while it is a team game, there are repetitive, individual confrontations that take place within the game. The baseball game cannot start without the individual pitcher against the hitter. Once the batted ball is in play, the battle is between the ability of the fielder against the speed of the baserunner. Once there is a runner on base, an attempt to steal a base pits the runner against the catcher. A base hit into the outfield pits the outfielder against a runner trying to score.

Baseball is a team game with many smaller units at play. Without all those smaller units working together and achieving their tasks, the team will lose.

Romans 12 puts our stewardship of the Gospel in a similar setting. The church is certainly described as a team, if you will.

Verse 3: *“For by the grace given to me I say to everyone among you not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think, but to think with sober judgment, each according to the measure of faith that*

God has assigned.” This is where the Body of Christ is really seen as a team. No one member of the baseball team can win the game by themselves. In the same way, no one part of the Body of Christ can accomplish stewardship of the Gospel alone. The pastor cannot. The congregational chair cannot. The lead soprano in the choir cannot. But each of these individuals have been added to the local congregation to be built into a team that can win the victory with Jesus.

Verses 4–5: *“For as in one body we have many members, and the members do not all have the same function, so we, though many, are one body in Christ, and individually members one of another.”* In baseball, the pitcher pitches. The catcher catches. The hitter hits. When a pitcher attempts to hit, the result is usually not very pretty. Catchers often do not excel at running the bases. The hitter usually does not do well when they are sent to the mound to pitch. Every member of the Body of Christ has a unique set of abilities and functions. Not everyone preaches. Not everyone leads. Not everyone sings well. Yet when the congregation assembles together as a team, it can succeed in ways unattainable by the individual.

Verses 6–8: *“Having gifts that differ according to the grace given to us, let us use them: if prophecy, in proportion to our faith; if service, in our serving; the one who teaches, in his teaching; the one who exhorts, in his exhortation; the one who contributes, in generosity; the one who leads, with zeal; the one*

who does acts of mercy, with cheerfulness." Each member of the team has a role to play. Abilities and opportunities are entrusted to the individual members of the Body of Christ to be used for the ultimate purpose of stewarding the Gospel for the glory of God and the benefit of the neighbour. The one preaching is no more or less important than the others. The one serving or the one teaching, the leader or the merciful one — all are equally important in the faithful stewardship of all that the Lord has entrusted to the Body of Christ. All this stewardship is for the sake of the other!

A baseball team can have five All-Star pitchers but cannot win if the hitters do not hit. The best lineup in the league will struggle if the pitchers cannot get anyone on the other team out. Pitchers need the defense behind them to play well. Coaches need to lead well. When they all work together, you have a winning baseball team. When the Body of Christ has all its members faithfully stewarding the unique individual talents that have been entrusted to them, the victory goes to Jesus! This is the goal of faithful stewardship! It is all about Jesus!

The Board of Stewardship wants to thank you for your faithful giving during 2024 which resulted in a surplus for the year of \$19,121. On the basis of these results, the Board of Stewardship put forward a motion at the April 27, 2025, meeting of the voters recommending approval of a transfer of \$10,000 from our operating surplus account to a Designated Reserve Fund to be used for future capital equipment or repairs that might be required. The motion was approved making the money available when the need arises.

While we ended 2024 in a positive surplus position, our 2025 results to the end of February show a deficit of \$10,867. This compares to a deficit at the end of February 2024 of \$11,217. As we move into the spring and summer months we know our cash flow slows down somewhat so we encourage you to keep St. Paul's mission and ministry in mind at this time of year when they will pick up in a few months.

EVANGELISM and PUBLIC RELATIONS

LIFTED UP!

“For thus says the One who is high and lifted up, who inhabits eternity, whose name is Holy: ‘I dwell in the high and holy place, and also with him who is of a contrite and lowly spirit, to revive the spirit of the lowly, and to revive the heart of the contrite’” (Isaiah 57:15 ESV).

My first remembrance of being “lifted up” was as a very young child. It was my father’s strong arms that scooped me up into a “bear hug” as he returned home at the end of his workday. Besides feeling safe and secure within his embrace, I enjoyed the opportunity to view my surroundings from an entirely different perspective. I could see the top of our refrigerator and I was at eye level with the portable radio my parents had placed there. For those few moments in time, I was given a glimpse of what it was like to be as tall as Daddy.

“So when [His disciples] had come together, they asked [Jesus], ‘Lord, will You at this time restore the kingdom to Israel?’ He said to them, ‘It is not for you to know times or seasons that the Father has fixed by His own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be My witnesses in



Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth.’ And when He had said these things, as they were looking on, He was lifted up, and a cloud took Him out of their sight. And while they were gazing into heaven as He went, behold, two men stood by them in white robes, and said, ‘Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking into heaven? This Jesus, who was taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw Him go into heaven’” (Acts 1:6-11 ESV).

With their feet firmly planted on the ground, it would have been difficult for Jesus’ disciples to view their future from His perspective. It is no wonder they continued looking into heaven after Jesus had been lifted up above the clouds and out of their sight. It is also no wonder that Jesus had instructed them to remain in Jerusalem until the Holy Spirit had come upon

them, for He knew that only the Holy Spirit’s power could give them the heavenly perspective they would need to be His witnesses *“to the end of the earth.”*

We, who have also received the power of the Holy Spirit through baptism and serve our Lord and Saviour as He enables us, await

that Great Day of Jesus’ return and envision it according to what the scriptures have revealed. With this perspective in mind, we have no doubt that we will see the following prophecy fulfilled.

“It shall come to pass in the latter days that the mountain of the house of the LORD shall be established as the highest of the mountains, and it shall be lifted up above the hills; and peoples shall flow to it, and many nations shall come, and say: ‘Come, let us go up to the mountain of the Lord, to the house of the God of Jacob, that He may teach us His ways and that we may walk in His paths.’ For out of Zion shall go forth the law [or teaching (according to a footnote included by www.esv.org)], and the word of the Lord from Jerusalem” (Micah 4:1-2 ESV).
