Names of Jesus Ornament Cards Suggestions for Family Discussion/Activities

The chapoter numbers (and not the exact verses) were deliberately included so that each specific Name of Jesus might be read in a greater context as applicable. If a chapter (or a smaller section) is read aloud, have your children listen closely for that day's Name of Jesus to be spoken aloud. Below are examples of discussion questions and/or acctivities that could be utilized for a greater understanding of each name. These discussions could be incorporated into mealtime discussions, homeschool activities, prayer time, or bedtime routines.

- 1. Jesus: Look up wht the name Jesus means. Why was this a good name for Him? Look up the name meaning for each family member and share them. How does a person's name describe them? Why did your parents give you your name?
- 2. Light of the World: A light shines into dark places and helps us to see while we are in the darkness. How are each of us in darkness? How is the whole world in darkness? How does Jesus shine Himself into each one of us to drive out the darkness? How can we be a light like Jesus?
- 3. **Immanuel**: *Immanuel* (sometimes *Emmanuel*) is a Hebrew word that means "God is with us." Look up the original Hebrew to see how the language is written. Why is Immanuel an appropriate name for Jesus, especially during Christmas time?
- 4. **Christ**: *Christ* means "the anointed one." People who were specially designated by God for a holy mission were anointed with oil

- and they were often kings, priests or prophets. Jesus is all three of those! What was Jesus' mission in the world? What is your mission in the world?
- 5. **I Am**: God always was, is, and always will be. What does *always* mean? What does the word *forever* mean?
- 6. Lamb of God: Research how and why lambs were used in sacrifices to God in the Old Testament. Why was it important to sacrifice the most perfect and spotless lamb in the flock? How is Jesus like the best lamb?
- 7. **Son of David**: This first chapter of Matthew's Gospel covers the lineage of Jesus, starting with Kind David. Who was David and why was he important? Do you recognize any other names from Jesus' lineage? Who is in your family tree?
- 8. **Judge**: What does a judge do? What qualities are important in a judge? What does it mean that Jesus is Judge? How will we be judged at the end of our earthly lives?
- 9. **King of the Jews**: When Jesus was born, the wise men called Him the King of the Jews and went to look for Him so that they could worship Him. They brought Jesus gold, frankincense and myrrh as gifts. Research what these gifts might have looked like and what they were used for. Why do you think the Wise Men brought these gifts for the King of the Jews? How were they connected to Jesus' life?
- 10. The Sacrifice: What is a sacrifice? Jesus sacrificed Himself to take away the sins that keep us from Him, even though it was very

- painful, scary and hard to do. What is a sacrifice you can make for Jesus or for another person today?
- 11. **Son of God**: Review the mystery of the Holy Trinity God as the Father, Jesus as the Son and the Holy Spirit as three separate beings and yet one.
- 12. The Last Adam: Research the parallels between Adam and Jesus. Like Adam, Jesus was born without sin. However, Adam disobeyed God and turned mankind away from Him. Jesus came to undo what Adam did. Adam's disobedience to God's will brought death to mankind, but Jesus' obedience to God's will gave life to mankind. How did you obey God today?
- 13. **Rabbi**: The word Rabbi means "teacher." Jesus'apostles called Him Rabbi because He taught them how to love God and how to treat their fellow men and women. Who in your life has helped teach you how to love and serve God?
- 14. Alpha and Omega: Show your child the Greek letters that mean Alpha and Omega. Alpha is the beginning of the alphabet, and Omega is the end. What does it mean that Jesus is the beginning and the end of all things?
- 15. **High Priest**: Research the high priests and their duties in Judaism. In the Jewish religion during Jesus' time on earth, a high priest was a person who communicated between God and the people and who had to make a sacrifice for the people. How is Jesus a high priest? How is He different from an earthly high priest?

- 16. **Saviour**: Discuss what it means to save someone. What danger are we in? How has Jesus saved us?
- 17. **Bread of Life**: Jesus said,"I am the Bread of Life, he who comes to me shall not hunger." What does it mean to be hungry in a non-physical way? How have you been hungry lately? How does Jesus feed us?
- 18. Wonderful Counsellor: A counsellor offers direction and guidance to those who need it. Who is a counsellor for you? What guidance did Jesus offer to the world? How does Jesus continue to counsel you?
- 19. **King of Kings**: What is a king? What are other names for rulers (president, prime minister, sultan, chief, etc.)? Jesus is more powerful than all rulers, and all rulers on earth must obey Him. What is one way your country's rulers can obey Jesus?
- 20. **Redeemer**: Look up the definitions of the word "redeem." Why do we need to be redeemed? How has Jesus redeemed us?
- 21. **Son of Man**: Jesus was special because He was God in human form. Like all babies, He grew inside His mother Mary, was born, and lived on earth just like us. Why was it important that God became human?

- 22. **Mediator**: A mediator is someone who works between two people to help solve a conflict. Humans and God are in conflict when humans sin. How is Jesus the Mediator for humans? Who is a mediator in your home?
- 23. **Nazarene**: Find Nazareth on a map to show your children where Jesus grew up.
- 24. **Truth**: Jesus said, "I am the way, the truth and the life." What does true mean? How is Jesus the Truth?
- 245 Good Shepherd: What is a shepherd? From what dangers does he protect his sheep? How does Jesus the Good Shepherd protect us? Who else in your life acts as a shepherd for you?
- 26. The Almighty: To be almighty means to have complete power over everything. What are some of the almighty miracles that Jesus performed? What are some of the almighty creations that God has made?
- 27. **Our Peace**: What is peace? What makes you feel peaceful? How has Jesus brought peace to your heart/to your family? How can you share that peace with your family and friends?
- 28. **Bridegroom**: Just like a groom loves his bride and is excited to

- be married to her forever, so does Jesus love us and want to be with us forever. When we are finally with Jesus, it will be like a wedding. How do you think Jesus will celebrate with us?
- 29. The Resurrection and the Life: Jesus died and resurrected, or came back to life, so He could conquer death and make a way for each of us to have a life with Him forever. It is the most important reason for which Jesus was born on Earth! Review the story of Easter together.
- 30. The Cornerstone: For a building made of stones, the most important stone was the cornerstone, because all the weight rested on this stone. If the cornerstone was weak or was taken away, it would cause the whole building to crumble. How is Jesus like a cornerstone? Why do you think people rejected Jesus? Use objects like blocks or Tupperware to build a pyramid-like structure to show how a strong, steady foundation is necessary to keep the structure from falling.

Suggestions for Printing and Cutting:

Print at home or at a printing center on heavy white cardstock.

IMPORTANT:

- For the 4x4in version (larger cards), print <u>landscape</u>, head-to-head and double-sided, in order to ensure that the Names of Jesus print directly behind the numbers. There will be four cards per piece of paper.
- For the 2.75x2.75in version (smaller cards), print <u>portrait</u>, head-to-head and double-sided in order to ensure that the Names of Jesus print directly behind the numbers. There will be eight cards per piece of paper.

When cutting, use a paper cutter/trimmer with the "Name" side face-up (number side face-down) in order to better see the vertical outlines of the square print for easy cutting.


Suggestions for Set-Up and Display:


I suggest attaching them to a string with small clothespins or paperclips. You could make one long string to hang around a room, from a mantle, from door/window frames, or you could hang several rows of the cards on a smaller wall. Another suggestion is to clip them or string them onto your Christmas tree as ornaments or a garland. The smaller cards could be hole-punched and hung as ornaments. Have your children help you attach them onto the string or branches for a great fine motor activity!


There are 30 cards total, labeled numerically 1 through 30 with various Names/Titles of Jesus and each Bible chapter printed on the back. Here are some different ways to numerically order your Advent calendar (you will need to find out on which date Advent begins and how many days it lasts). You can...


- Begin with 1 as the first day of Advent. Find out how many days are in Advent and display that many days.
- Use the numbers as dates. For example, display (November) 29 as the first day of Advent, followed by 30, (December) 1, 2, 3, etc.
- Count backwards. Find out how many days are in Advent this year and display the numbers as a countdown (e.g., 29, 28, 27, 26...). Countdowns are fun for children and can keep them engaged!


