Foundations: A Journey of Faith

Foundations is one of the best ways to get connected at St. Philip's. This semester-long course explores the foundational beliefs of the Christian faith in an environment that allows for conversation and connection. For those who feel led to join St. Philip's, the class will culminate in the service of Confirmation when the bishop makes his annual visitation (typically on the Sunday after Easter). Foundations is offered both in the fall (beginning a week after Rally Sunday) and in the winter/spring (generally beginning the Sunday that falls after the New Year). Both newcomers to the church and longtime members will find the journey of Foundations to be an enriching, encouraging, and spiritually enlightening experience! St. Philip's Ministry to Children and Families offers several opportunities to connect children to Jesus in meaningful, age-appropriate ways as they worship and learn about God. Additionally, the ministry encourages and empowers each parent to live into the role of primary spiritual leader by providing resources, training and family events.

Sunday School: Birth-12th grade

9:15 a.m. - Various Locations

Available during the school year (Rally Sunday—mid-May), Sunday School provides Bible lessons for children from 4k through 12th grade (nursery provided for children 3 and under). Classes are divided by age and are taught by dedicated volunteers from our congregation. We use a Bible-centered curriculum, giving children a strong overview of the story of salvation and how it ties to a personal relationship with Jesus Christ. Curriculum details for 7th-grade Confirmation and 8th–12th grade Sunday school are on the next page. Classes for children in 4th grade and younger are located on the ground floor of the Parish House. Older children meet in other locations on our campus. Please see directional signs for exact locations. Parents of children 4th grade and younger should pick children up promptly at 10:15 am in the classroom if they are not staying for the nursery or Children's Church.

Jesus' "High Priestly Prayer" underlines his deep love, passion, and care for the apostles who inaugurate His church. Jesus' plan for the church unfolds in Acts, exactly like he told them! We are thankful to Luke for his diligent account of the life of Jesus and the Holy Spirit in Gospel of Luke and Acts. We are particularly thankful that Luke continued to write of events after the crucifixion, resurrection, and ascension of Jesus. Imagine how Paul's journey would be pieced together based on his epistles alone! Even with Acts, it is confusing!

Luke is interviewing eyewitnesses to understand the basis for true healing salvation while Paul is imprisoned in Caesarea awaiting extradition to Rome. Wilcock says it is like finding a stream and tracing it back to its source. You can just see him interviewing Mary and various others. He uses some source material that is considered primary as well. His signature qualities are thoroughness, accuracy and order.

C.S. Lewis's The Last Battle

Lewis's marvelous book The Last Battle, which is the last of The Chronicles of Narnia. It is a remarkable book on multiple levels and was awarded the Carnegie Medal back in the 1950s when it was first published. The Last Battle has some themes in common with The Great Divorce and That Hideous Strength that will make it an excellent follow-up to those two books, and like them, it has some remarkable resonance with things going on in today's culture. It is a book that is both theologically rich and poignantly beautiful in its writing, and it can help equip us to live boldly for Christ in a culture that has lost its way. (Although this book is the last of The Chronicles of Narnia, it can stand on its own and it is not necessary to have read the other books for this class.)




