

People And blessed be his kingdom, now and forever. Amen.

THE COLLECT FOR PURITY

The celebrant says

Almighty God, unto whom all hearts are open, all desires known, and from whom no secrets are hid: Cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of thy Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love thee, and worthily magnify thy holy Name; through Christ our Lord. Amen.

THE SUMMARY OF THE LAW

The celebrant says

Hear what our Lord Jesus Christ saith: Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind. This is the first and great commandment. And the second is like unto it: Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself. On these two commandments hang all the Law and the Prophets.

THE KYRIE

THE COLLECT OF THE DAY

Celebrant The Lord be with you. People And with thy spirit.

Celebrant Let us pray. The people kneel.

O Lord, who hast taught us that all our doings without charity are nothing worth: Send thy Holy Ghost and pour into our hearts that most excellent gift of charity, the very bond of peace and of all virtues, without which whosoever liveth is counted dead before thee. Grant this for thine only Son Jesus Christ's sake, who liveth and reigneth with thee and the same Holy Ghost, one God, now and for ever. *Amen.*

The people sit for the reading of God's word.

THE LESSON Romans 10:9-17

⁹ If you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. ¹⁰ For with the heart one believes and is justified, and with the mouth one confesses and is saved. ¹¹ For the Scripture says, "Everyone who believes in him will not be put to shame." ¹² For there is no distinction between Jew and Greek; for the same Lord is Lord of all, bestowing his riches on all who call on him. ¹³ For "everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved." How then will they call on him in whom they have not believed? And how are they to believe in him of whom they have never heard? And how are they to hear without someone preaching? ¹⁵ And how are they to preach unless they are sent? As it is written, "How beautiful are the feet of those who preach the good news!" ¹⁶ But they have not all obeyed the gospel. For Isaiah says, "Lord, who has believed what he has heard from us?" ¹⁷ So faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the word of Christ.

THE GOSPEL John 20:19-31

The people remain standing. The priest reads the Gospel, first saying

The Holy Gospel of Our Lord Jesus Christ according to St. John.

People Glory be to thee, O Lord.

¹⁹ On the evening of that day, the first day of the week, the doors being locked where the disciples were for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said to them, "Peace be with you." ²⁰ When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples were glad when they saw the Lord. ²¹ Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, even so I am sending you." ²² And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. ²³ If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you withhold forgiveness from any, it is withheld." ²⁴ Now Thomas, one of the twelve, called the Twin, was not with them when Jesus came. ²⁵ So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see in his hands the mark of the nails, and place my finger into the mark of the nails, and place my hand into his side, I will never believe." ²⁶ Eight days later, his disciples were inside again, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were locked, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." ²⁷ Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here, and see my hands; and put out your hand, and place it in my side. Do not disbelieve, but believe." ²⁸ Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!" ²⁹ Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed." ³⁰ Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of the disciples, which are not written in this book; ³¹ but these are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name.

God's Mission

THE NICENE CREED

All stand and say in unison

I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, and of all things visible and invisible; and in one Lord Jesus Christ, the only-begotten Son of God, begotten of his Father before all worlds, God of God, Light of Light, very God of very God, begotten, not made, being of one substance with the Father; by whom all things were made; who for us men and for our salvation came down from heaven, and was incarnate by the Holy Ghost of the Virgin Mary, and was made man; and was crucified also for us under Pontius Pilate; he suffered and was buried; and the third day he rose again according to the Scriptures, and ascended into heaven, and sitteth on the right hand of the Father; and he shall come again, with glory, to judge both the quick and the dead; whose kingdom shall have no end. And I believe in the Holy Ghost, the Lord, and Giver of Life, who proceedeth from the Father and the Son; who with the Father and the Son together is worshiped and glorified; who spake by the Prophets. And I believe one holy catholic and Apostolic Church; I acknowledge one Baptism for the remission of sins; and I look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

THE PRAYERS OF THE PEOPLE

The leader and people kneel and pray responsively

Father, we pray for your holy catholic Church; that we all may be one.

Grant that every member of the Church may truly and humbly serve you; *that your Name may be glorified by all people.* We pray for all bishops, priests, and deacons; *that they may be faithful ministers of your Word and Sacraments.*

We pray for all who govern and hold authority in the nations of the world; *that there may be justice and peace on the earth.*

Give us grace to do your will in all that we undertake; that our works may find favor in your sight.

Have compassion on those who suffer from any grief or trouble; that they may be delivered from their distress.

Give to the departed eternal rest; let light perpetual shine upon them.

We praise you for your saints who have entered into joy; may we also come to share in your heavenly kingdom.

The celebrant continues

Almighty God, to whom our needs are known before we ask: Help us to ask only what accords with your will; and those good things which we dare not, or in our blindness cannot ask, grant us for the sake of your Son Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

CONFESSION OF SIN

Celebrant Let us humbly confess our sins unto Almighty God.

The celebrant and people say in unison

Almighty God, Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, maker of all things, judge of all men: We acknowledge and bewail our manifold sins and wickedness, which we from time to time most grievously have committed, by thought, word, and deed, against thy divine Majesty, provoking most justly thy wrath and indignation against us. We do earnestly repent, and are heartily sorry for these our misdoings; the remembrance of them is grievous unto us, the burden of them is intolerable. Have mercy upon us, have mercy upon us, most merciful Father; for thy Son our Lord Jesus Christ's sake, forgive us all that is past; and grant that we may ever hereafter serve and please thee in newness of life, to the honor and glory of thy Name; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

THE ABSOLUTION

The celebrant stands and says

Almighty God, our heavenly Father, who of his great mercy hath promised forgiveness of sins to all those who with hearty repentance and true faith turn unto him, have mercy upon you, pardon and deliver you from all your sins, confirm and strengthen you in all goodness, and bring you to everlasting life; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

THE COMFORTABLE WORDS

The celebrant reads several sentences from Scripture.

Hear the Word of God to all who truly turn to him. Come unto me, all ye that travail and are heavy laden, and I will refresh you. (Matthew 11:28) God so loved the world, that he gave his only-begotten Son, to the end that all that believe in him should not perish, but have everlasting life. (John 3:16) This is a true saying, and worthy of all men to be received, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners. (1 Timothy 1:15) If any man sin, we have an Advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous; and he is the perfect offering for our sins, and not for ours only, but for the sins of the whole world. (1 John 2:1-2)

World Missions at St. Philip's Church

Honduran Medical Missions: Since 1990, St. Philip's has played a role in bringing much-needed medical care to the impoverished country of Honduras through the Honduran Medical Missions led by Drs. Ken and Pat Holden. From 1990-2000, St. Philip's sent teams to the remote mountain village of Protección. Since 1998, the Holdens have led teams to serve in and around the capital city of Tegucigalpa, working with several different Christian ministries. For many of the people they see, the medicine sent by St. Philip's is the only medicine they ever receive. Each person who comes to these clinics is offered prayer and an opportunity to learn about Christ.

La Gonâve Haiti Partners: In the late 1980s, St. Philip's fostered a relationship with a young priest assigned to La Gonâve Island in Haiti. Through that relationship began our Mission of Presence in St. Jean Baptiste, our adopted "sister church," and its mountain community. In partnership with other US churches, St. Philip's adopted ten communities and churches on the island with a focus on Christian education, health, agriculture, clean water, adult literacy programs, teacher trainings, Bible studies, musical programs, and microfinancing business. St. Jean Baptiste prays for St. Philip's as we do for them, and every year in June, members of St. Philip's travel to this forgotten island with hearts of love, joining them to celebrate and encourage St. John the Baptist Feast Day with a Spirit-filled Anglican worship service.

LAMB is a Christ-centered ministry based in Tegucigalpa, Honduras, that seeks to reach out to the world with the love of Jesus. Founded in 1999 by Suzy McCall, LAMB was—at first—a training school for Hondurans called to world mission. Today LAMB also operates a school for over 240 children in one of the most desperately poor areas of Tegucigalpa, an outreach program that gives over 100 youth an alternative to gang life, a savings program that supports micro-businesses, and a children's home for over 60 children whose lives have been marked by abuse and neglect. In addition, LAMB has 22 young people who have grown up at the children's home and are now transitioning into Christ-following adults as they attend university, gain technical training, or begin their jobs or careers.

Suzy McCall is a lifetime missionary sponsored by St. Philip's, where she served as Director of Christian Education before answering God's call to serve Him in Honduras. In 1990, she joined a church-planting team and ministered faithfully until Hurricane Mitch struck Honduras in 1998. Through that disaster, God led Suzy to begin a new ministry, the LAMB Institute. After serving as field director for over a decade, Suzy turned the reins of the ministry over to the very dedicated Honduran leadership she had mentored, and she continues to serve as LAMB's spiritual director. Suzy was ordained an Anglican priest in 2013 and serves as pastor of the Church of the Good Shepherd at the LAMB Children's Home. She has eight children and one grandchild.

The Dufatanye Organization: For almost six years, Martha Vetter taught Bible to 450 orphans in Rwanda. In 2008, she began to minister with the Dufatanye Organization (DO) in Nyanza, Rwanda. The term *dufatanye* means "to join together," and it aptly describes how this Christ-centered ministry reaches out to victims of genocide, AIDS, and poverty. DO members work together to cultivate a 25-acre farm, which includes 2500 banana trees. They build homes for widows, facilitate Bible and health education seminars, raise livestock, manage a fish hatchery and fifteen fish farms, assist with medical navigation, host a Bible and Breakfast Club for 500 children, and now reach out to five "Villages of Hope" in distant impoverished communities. One long-range goal is to establish an on-site teaching center that trains others to build similar Christ-centered endeavors to serve the poor.

Water Mission: Founded by St. Philippians George and Molly Greene, Water Mission is a nonprofit Christian engineering ministry that provides sustainable safe-water solutions, through a Christian world view perspective, to people in developing countries and disaster areas. Water Mission meets desperate needs all over the world at times of greatest crisis in the name of Jesus. Each water treatment system converts contaminated water to safe drinking water in volumes large enough to support an entire community! Along with that water comes the opportunity to hear the message of Jesus Christ, our Living Water.

Uganda Christian University Partners: Uganda Christian University is the largest Anglican University in Uganda, educating the next generation of Christian leaders with five campuses spread across the nation and a student body of 14,000. UCU has a full range of academic majors—theology, law, education, science, medicine, and many more. UCU Partners is the U.S. organization that provides funds for need-based tuition scholarships, as well as needed equipment, including medical equipment for the recent launch of the medical school, which can train 60 medical doctors and 10 dentists. UCUP raised \$150,000 to build a new microbiology and pathology lab for the school of medicine. Tom and Jayne Gurley lived on the campus of UCU for nine months and taught science, labs, and English classes.

Open Doors (The Persecuted Church): Open Doors is a ministry which cares for the needs of persecuted Christians. There are 260 million Christians worldwide today who experience high levels of persecution in the top 50 countries on the World Watch List. Eight Christians are killed every day for their faith. We at St. Philip's want to come alongside these brothers and sisters in prayer and support. Visit opendoorsusa.org to find the World Watch List that Open Doors compiles yearly. Along with this important report, you will find a prayer guide for Christians in each of the 50 countries.

Anglican Frontier Missions (AFM): AFM seeks to plant indigenous churches among the least evangelized peoples in the world. More than 7,000 ethno-linguistic people groups comprising 3 billion people are unreached, with little to no geographic and/or cultural access to the gospel. AFM works alongside churches, mobilizing them to send short- and long-term missionaries to do pioneer, frontier missions in areas where a viable and visible church still does not exist.
