Suffolk's Winter Shelter program will be the recipient of this month's local missions giving. A grant has supplied funds to house 56 adults in 2 local motels throughout the winter. This program is a Housing First model, meaning the focus is on moving participants into permanent housing as quickly as possible (which currently is in short supply.) The program plans to run through the month of June, if possible and our own Cheryl Griffin heads this effort. The money we donate will help fill other needs of those in the program, such as toiletries, laundry supplies, gas to get them to a new job until first paycheck, medications, etc. The needs are many and your contribution will make an immediate difference in someone's life. Thank you for your generous support of our local missions.

Beyond Our Shores:

*The Board of Deacons voted in March to send \$500 from the "**Dollars for Supply and Multiply Fund**" to that group to help a little boy in Haiti who has had surgery on his legs but is unable to walk. He needs physical therapy to regain use of his legs and this donation will help supply that need. Your continued contributions of dollar bills in the collection plate means we can do even more for our Haitian friends. Thank you!
