#### **Our Mission Dollars at Work**

In recent months we have sent our special monthly offerings for Ukraine and Disaster Relief to the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship. In their summer 2023 newsletter, they reported the following: **Ukraine:** 1,129 individuals, 178 churches, and 18 organizations donated \$1.24 million dollars. These donations helped meet the needs of people in Ukraine as well as those Ukrainians who are now in refugee camps in foreign countries.

**Disaster Response:** CBF's Disaster Response exists to help people and churches to serve communities affected by disaster. This year they have responded to flooding in KY as well as Hurricane Fiona in Puerto Rico and the Dominican Republic and Hurricane Ian in Florida. Volunteers have offered 1,800 volunteer hours and CBF has assembled and distributed 1,800 response buckets (valued at \$180,000.00)

## "The God of His Word" Study

## Tuesday, September 12th or Wednesday, September 13th

We will start a new book study in September called "The God of His Word". This study is based on the book called "The God of the Way" book which we studied earlier in the year. If you purchased the book for the other study, you would only need to purchase the study guide for this series. You can come either Tuesday evenings @ 7:00 pm or Wednesday mornings @ 10:00 am. The study will be held in the Conference Room. This six-session Bible study *The God of His Word* tells the story of the Creation and how the Word-Jesus-was there with the Father from the beginning. Viewers will learn about Jesus (the "Word") entering into the world, teaching the people through parables about the kingdom of heaven, calling of the disciples, treating his female followers with love and respect, and revealing to us today that all things are possible with God. (Cast for the oratorios include Danny Gokey, The Shindellas, the Gateway Church Choir, and the Nashville Gospel Choir.)
