Crossover Global Ministries is a 501C (3) nonprofit organization founded in 2024 by Joshua and Jennifer Worrell and Seth and Roxanne Brown, local residents of Suffolk and Kill Devil Hills, NC. The Worrells and the Browns have been missionaries to several areas, including Haiti, Honduras, Africa, and the Philippines. God has called them to expand their ministry in the Philippines working along with the local ministry Asia Center for Missions, "Towards No More Unreached." The goal of Crossover Global Ministries is to equip local pastors and leaders, utilizing the tools given to them to reach their youth and the community of which they are a part. The organization was created as a result of God's call to spread the Gospel to unreached people groups. The aim is to develop leaders, spiritually and practically, through athletics to go out in their communities and spread the love and hope of Jesus and build His Kingdom using the 4 C's: Communication, Character, Confidence, and Consistency. Athletics opens the door to minister to young people and gives them the hope of Jesus Christ. Crossover is currently working in the Philippines having trained 20 different pastors and leaders and reaching over 225 young people through the game of basketball, home visits and kids' Bible Clubs.
