The Board of Deacons Report....from the January 8th 2025 meeting

Cheryl Griffin, Director of Beacon of Hope asked the deacons if we could possibly help feed the homeless at the shelter the week of January 13th. 20 to 25 people were served breakfast, lunch and dinner. Enough volunteers from the church responded to help in this endeavor.

The Pastoral Search committee announced that a candidate will be arriving the weekend of March 13 to meet the deacons and other members of the boards of the church. They will have a meet and greet on Saturday to introduce him and his family to our church members and then he will preach the sermon on Sunday. After the service, a vote will be held to approve or disapprove the search committee's selection.




CARE AND CONCERN



WHAT A WAY TO END THE YEAR!

Greetings fellow Suffolk Christians! At our first Board of Finance meeting for 2025, our Church Treasurer, Judy Eure (who will tell you herself that she's often the bearer of doom and gloom), was almost giddy when she announced that our total income for the month of December 2024 was just shy of \$47,000. That's not a typo, friends. \$46,738 in total revenue was received in just one month! Considering that \$2,000 of that was earmarked for missions and we received a generous one-time payment from the city for right of easement, we still received over \$31,000 in loose offerings for the month! That is almost TWICE the amount we have been receiving in a "typical" month. All I can say is "thank you" and "praise the Lord".

Earlier in the month of December, the Board of Deacons announced a new initiative to make the 5th Sunday of any month – beginning with December 2024 - a Sunday of extra giving, encouraging everyone to dig a little deeper, if possible, and give a little extra in their offerings. This initiative most certainly played a huge part in the "extra" income we received in December. We have 4 months in 2025 that will have 5 Sundays (March, June, August, and November), so it is my prayer that we will continue this trend of giving so generously - not only during our normal monthly offerings, but even more so on those 5th Sundays!!

After paying all the bills and salaries for the month of December, we still ended the month with a "surplus" of almost \$24,000 and an overall surplus of \$9,000 for the year. This is an incredible outcome! Earlier last year the Board of Finance had to make the difficult, but necessary, decision to withdraw \$20,000 from one of our investment accounts just to help make ends meet. Our December income has helped to significantly offset that withdrawal and is a wonderful way to end the year!

Thank you all so much for your generosity and support of our church and its missions!
