I hope that you will plan to join us for the season of Lent. Lent comes from the Anglo Saxon word *lencten*, meaning "lengthen" and refers to the lengthening days of spring. The forty days of Lent represent the time Jesus spent in the wilderness, enduring the temptations and preparing to begin his ministry. This year, our theme for Lent is "Bless the Lent We Actually Have," based on the work of Kate Bowler. Here are the topics for each week:

Ash Wednesday – February 14th, 7:00 p.m. Blessed are the Fragile
First Sunday of Lent Blessed are the Imperfect
Second Sunday of Lent Blessed are the Curious
Third Sunday of Lent Blessed are those who Suffer
Fourth Sunday of Lent Blessed are those who Feel Alone
Fifth Sunday of Lent Blessed are those who Mourn
Palm Sunday March 24th Blessed are the Rejected
Easter Sunday March 31st Blessed are those who still Hope

COTTLET The Board of Deacons Reports.....from the January 10, 2024 Meeting

- *Congregational updates were given by Dr. Hartman.
- *A new Missions Committee was established for 2024 with Rob Abernathy as chair. It was decided that the February yellow envelope mission will be "Coats for the Community."
- *The Pastoral Search team gave a report.
- *It was reported that the All Saints Presbyterian church had begun their double Sunday services.
- *A report was given by the committee looking into the feasibility of our church affiliating with a conference/denomination. They had met once to establish a plan as to how to proceed. Tracy reported that Mark Snipes from CBF could possible come in March to talk about CBF and affiliation in general.
- *Tracy reported that she will soon meet with those who signed up to take leadership roles with the four initiatives established at a previous Town Hall meeting.
- *Deacons were given their committee assignments for the year.
- *A plan was made for how to conduct the Town Hall meeting on January 21 with the purpose of giving the congregation a better understanding of the rational for the changes that were made to the SCC constitution. It was decided to provide a "Feedback" slip of paper so that members could give their opinions on several of the changes in dispute.
- *The annual Deacons' dinner was discussed and a Feb. event is being planned.
- *An Ash Wednesday service will be held on Feb. 14, which is a regular Deacon meeting night. The Feb. meeting for the board will take place Feb. 13, instead.
- *The next open session to which SCC congregants will be invited to attend with concerns or issues will take place at the April meeting.
- *Tracy made the board aware of a free seminar for small church leaders to be held in an online forum in February.
- *Tracy informed the board that Sharon Catala will join the church on January 14.



Town Hall Update

On Sunday, January 21, the congregation gathered for an amazing pot luck lunch hosted by the deacons. The purpose of the meeting was to continue discussion about the proposed changes to the church constitution. At the Fall Conference, when the members of SCC voted not to ratify the new constitution, members were asked to list their concerns about the new document. The deacons reviewed all the feedback, and responded at this Town Hall with the rationale for each proposed change. Members had the opportunity to ask questions and once again provide written feedback about their preferences for the constitution. Forty-three members provided feedback. On the quorum, 25 members voted to leave it at 50, 18 voted to change it to 35. With regard to the ushers, 37 members voted to make them a committee, 5 voted for them to remain a board, and 1 had no preference. The deacons will make changes in the constitution based on your feedback.

At the Town Hall, several members also shared their concerns about hard feelings this process has caused and the resulting lack of unity in our congregation. Tracy fielded related questions and comments about these concerns and the meeting concluded with the hymn, "Bless be the Tie that Binds."

Knowing that we need God's help to heal, Tracy called for a special prayer meeting on Wednesday, January 24, 2024. 22 attended this meeting which focused on healing and unity among us. Please continue to pray in the days ahead for Suffolk Christian Church as well as each member, lay leader and staff person.
