This month we will continue to celebrate the season of Epiphany as the Scriptures shed new light on who Jesus is each week. On February 7<sup>th</sup> we will explore Jesus' dedication in the temple in Luke 2:22-40. On February 13th, we'll read the story of Jesus calling his first disciples. The last two weeks of the season we'll struggle with how Jesus calls us to live. We'll end the month with Transfiguration Sunday where Jesus will be transformed into light. Plan to join us each week as God surprises us time and time again and we see how these passages relate to us in these challenging days.

We will also hold our first two Town Hall meetings this month. Please continue to pray for the transition team, our congregation, and the pastor that God is preparing to call to live and serve at Suffolk Christian Church. Please participate in the meetings, your voice and your story matters!

Finally, you are invited to join me in West Memorial on Wednesday January 26<sup>th</sup> from 1:00 – 2:30 p.m. for a presentation by the Lilly Endowment entitled: Exploring the Pandemic's Impact on Congregations: What Do We Know and What Do We Still Need to Learn? This workshop will report new findings from two recent surveys (from August and December 2021) of 4000 churches about how they and their clergy are faring and the challenges and possibilities facing faith communities. It will provide an overview of an extensive Lilly Endowment-funded research project led by Hartford Institute for Religion Research to track what the next five years will look like for faith communities, their leaders and members. Finally, it will explore ways that congregations can participate and be informed by this ongoing research and take advantage of the resources produced.

- 3. When you think about how SCC has related to the community and work, what do you think has been most important? How do we express God's love, mercy and justice to others?
- 4. What recurring event most defines SCC?

#### February's Mission: Meals on Wheels

Please use your yellow envelope this month to support this very worthwhile mission. Meals on Wheels receives no government funding which makes your donation so important to them. People

in our community who need help with the provision of their daily meals can sign up to receive 2 each day, Monday through Friday. One meal is cold and one, hot and each is prepared and packaged by Obici Hospital. Our church sponsors a team and has numerous volunteers who participate <u>but can always use more help</u>. Our SCC team delivers the Friday route to the Chuckatuck area and there are always two volunteers who travel together. Kitty Martin is the chair of our team and she says this mission warms her heart because people are always so appreciative. Carmen Halley, one of our volunteers, says a huge part of this mission is the contact between volunteer and recipient. It is sometimes the only person they see in a day. Carmen says it takes about an hour to deliver to 10-15 people and her turn (with Michael) comes around every 5-6 weeks. Even under Covid conditions people have faithfully delivered meals although for now they are usually left at the front door. Perhaps God is calling you to this mission. If you are willing to serve Him in this way, please let the church office know or talk to Kitty.


#### UPDATED COVID-19 PROTOCOLS



The new church building, which encompasses our present-day sanctuary, cost \$40,000.00 and was the largest sanctuary in the city at that time, with a seating capacity of about 600 people. It was the second public building in Suffolk to be wired for electricity. A dedication service was held on Sunday, January 28<sup>th</sup>, 1894.

Except from "History Suffolk Christian Church 1860-1960"






The **Afternoon Circle** will meet on February 7<sup>th</sup> at 1:00. All are welcome to join!



#### December 31, 2021

"A rising tide raises all ships." Over the past years Supply and Multiply has had numerous organizations come alongside us to encourage us and support the calling place on the ministry. Organizations like Learning to Hope in Haiti have stayed at our guest house, loved on the elderly, sang and brought supplies to the Matthew 25 House, and continued to pour into the schools and orphanages in Montrouis. We have had other organizations like World Race come to grow with God, love others, and make a difference in the world. We had a student pilot from Missionary Flights International serve alongside a mission team to gain a better understanding their mission field. We have medical students from schools come and work with our elderly and provide them with physical therapy and most recently they've been working with our vision impaired in the use of a walking stick.

We are excited to share with you some ways that Supply and Multiply will be working with other organizations in Haiti and other locations to meet the needs of Haitians. We will start the year working with an organization in the Dominican Republic that comes alongside Haitian children, housing them in an orphanage which provides for them a home, education, and most importantly, the love of Christ. We will also be ministering to Haitians that live in bateyes, a term used to refer to a rural community of sugarcane workers. They work under the most oppressive conditions. In February will be working with the Tim Tebow Foundation to host the Night to Shine event in Montrouis Haiti. Night to Shine is an unforgettable prom night experience, centered on God's love, for people with special needs ages 14 and older. Many of the attenders are people that we minister to in various ways in Montrouis.

Supply and Multiply has been blessed from its inception to partner with individuals, churches, businesses, and communities to serve the Haitian population. All of the additional ministries that Supply and Multiply is working with and coming along side do not take from any of the existing programs. It strengthens them. Right now during this most difficult season when it's is hard to have our feet on the ground in Haiti or host mission teams in Montronis due to the instability, we are walking in obedience, faith, and wisdom.

God has opened doors for us to continue to serve the Haitian community in a new capacity. We will be working with those that have escaped the oppression and ills of Haiti and unfortunately fallen into another one in the Dominican Republic. We will continue to support and encourage the Supply and Multiply staff and ministries in Haiti. When we are in the Dominican Republic we are prayerful that some of the Supply and Multiply Staff will join us. This will allow us to encourage them. In addition, it will allow them to serve their native countryman and bring supplies and resources back with them to Haiti. It also continues the desire of people who have partnered with Supply and Multiply to go on mission and leave the walls of their church.

We see everything that God is doing as His provision and ordained steps. I started this letter by saying a rising tide raises all ships and I'll end it by reemphasize that point and add one more thing. To the extent that we participate with what God is doing together as the kingdom of believers, when we bring Christ compassion and His message to the world, we give Him the ultimate glory and ultimate praise that He is descrying of and due.

We ask for your prayers for the Nation of Haiti. Specifically, for there to be an established government, open roads and port, functioning hospitals and medical centers, schools filled with students, and most importantly for Christ to enter into the hearts and minds of people to transform the evil and encourage and bring hope to the believers.
