

FROM THE HOUSE OF WORSHIP COMMITTEE

"What's In a Name"?

Greetings fellow Christians!

Most of you reading this already know the purpose of our House of Worship Committee. However, to those who may be new to the church, the title of our committee can be somewhat of a misnomer. Perhaps a more

appropriate title would be the Building Maintenance and Security Committee. But that's a mouthful and "HOW" sounds so much cooler © So, since the purpose of our committee is to ensure the upkeep of our church, as well as the safety and security of those who enter it to meet, learn, and worship, the title "House of Worship Committee" suits us just fine.

While everything our committee does is for the glory of God, most of the things we do are "behind the scenes". You may occasionally see some repair work in progress (like, most recently, the newly repaired and painted walls outside the entrance to the balcony or the repairs to the termite damaged floor in the Beginner's Dept) but there are also dozens of things each month that get done without many knowing about it at all. Many tasks are fairly simple things like inspecting the numerous fire extinguishers throughout the church, changing burned out light bulbs, replacing HVAC filters, cleaning debris from various water drains, pulling weeds, trimming hedges, and even ensuring our elevators and sprinkler systems are inspected by professional technicians on a regular basis.

Of course, as would be expected of a 160+ year old building, there are often major issues that arise that are way beyond our level of expertise or capabilities (like the current water leak that was detected under the crawl space in the basement and the severely damaged roof over the front entrance). When these things arise, your HOW Committee contracts with repair professionals and monitors the repairs from start to finish.

Additionally, with the news of tragic events occurring in places of worship all over the country these days, your HOW Committee ensures that one committee member roams the hallways and monitors the entrances from the time the early worship service begins at 8:45 am until everyone has left after the 11:00 am worship. This not only keeps you safe while you attend Sunday School and worship in the sanctuary but also ensures that our youngest Christians are safe in the nursery, Beginner's Dept, and children's Sunday School classes each week.

To say that the HOW Committee stays busy is an understatement and that's why **WE NEED YOUR HELP!** We currently only have 10 members on our committee (we are allowed by church constitution to have 12) and half of those are members who just finished serving a 3-year term on the committee at the end of last year but were gracious enough to voluntarily serve an additional year (with approval from the Executive Board, of course).

You **do not** have to be an experienced carpenter, electrician, plumber, or security guard to serve on our committee (but if you are, we'd LOVE to have your help). Nor do you have to be a man!!!! We need <u>people</u> (male, female, young, old, short, or tall) who can pull weeds or inspect fire extinguishers just as much as we need <u>people</u> who can repair a broken toilet or a termite damaged floor. And we also need people who are simply available during the day to sometimes come to the church, provide access to repair technicians, and stay until their work is complete.

We have an absolutely beautiful church that is a very safe and secure place in which to worship. It's a challenge keeping it that way, but there is strength in numbers! We have two positions that can still be filled this year and we will need many more to fill vacancies next year. So please let me or any other HOW Committee member (Jimmy Fanny, Charles Parr, Douglas Parr, Jonnie Winslow, Robert Boyce, Bill Shumate, Travis Myles, Neal Davis, and Bennett McBride) know if you are interested in joining us.

(And, if it's that "commitment" word that is keeping you away, we will gladly welcome volunteers to assist us anytime).


