March's Mission: Western Tidewater Free Clinic (WTFC)

WTFC is a Health Home ...Comprehensive, Coordinated, Compassionate

The Clinic was opened in 2007 with a service area of 1,400 square miles. It has since expanded to serve 2,200 square miles, which includes Suffolk, Franklin, and Isle of Wight, Southampton, Surry, and Sussex counties. In 2009, WTFC relocated to larger facilities at 2019 Meade Parkway in Suffolk.

Western Tidewater Free Clinic (WTFC) is a health home for uninsured, underinsured and underserved adults in Western Tidewater, delivering compassionate and high-quality health care through the following services:

- Medical Care, with day and evening clinics
- Dental Care, with day and evening clinics
- Vision Care
- Woman's Health Program
- Medical Specialists, Partnerships, and Referrals
- Mental Health Counseling
- One-on-one Patient Education
- Pharmacy services
- Referrals to Community-based Agencies

The mission of the Western Tidewater Free Clinic is to provide high-quality, nonemergency health care to the residents of Western Tidewater who cannot otherwise afford it.

Some say that St. Patrick (or St. Declan) introduced the Celtic Cross in attempt to convert pagan kings to Christianity. One theory is he took the circular pattern of the pagan sun god and combined it with the cross of Jesus Christ to represent God's light and life. Another is he took the moon goddess symbol (a circle) and marked with a cross creating the first Celtic Cross.

Other possible origins are also combinations done by Christians or missionaries.

- One is they put the cross on top of the circle (representing the sun god and moon goddess) to illustrate Christ as the supreme God.
- Another is they carved crosses from large standing stones that were originally Druid phallic symbols to disguise their original form.



CARE AND CONCERN



Fabric and Yarn Update by Muriel Shumate



Ephesians 4:11 "It was he who gave some to be apostles, some to be prophets, some to be evangelists, and some to be pastors and teachers." He also gave some to be able to knit and sew for ministering.

Some time back I requested fabric and yarn for the Seaman's ministry by the Portsmouth Baptist Association. I received quite a bit of both. Last year I sewed, if I remember correctly, 146 ditty bags and then found the Portsmouth Baptist Association is not filling the bags any more for lack of somewhere to store and fill them, so I gave them to our group that ministers in Hatti. In 2019 I knitted 22 ski caps and Suffolk Christian Homeless ministry asked for them for them, so they were used for the homeless. In 2020 I completed 22 caps which have not been distributed as yet due to the Covid scare. I have knitted all the yarn donated.

The Suffolk Chapter of the UDC identified a need at Autumn Care for lap robes and provided many to the home. As the Portsmouth Baptist Association is not doing ditty bags at this time, I am using the fabric that I received to make lap robes for the residents of Autumn Care. So far, I have completed ten and have fabric to do a few more. Eight of these have not been distributed as the home is not accepting anything at this time due to Covid. There is always a need for lap robes, and they will be welcomed when they can accept them.

It makes me feel good to take left over fabric and yarn that was stored in someone's closet and use it for those who have a need. It is a good example of how God uses people and things in unique ways.

Not bragging about what I do, just thought you would like to know what is happening to all the fabric and yarn I received.
