The Board of Deacons Reports ....

The Board of Deacons met on Tuesday 9 April with an open session.

The updated Constitution is currently laying on the table, as required. We will hold a called Church Conference on May 19th immediately following the 11:00am service to vote on the proposed changes.

As part of the four initiates discussed during the January Town Hall 3 of the 4 initiatives are active:

• SCC continues their support of feeding the homeless by providing meals the week of 15 April.

 $\circ$  The Women's Fellowship has held 3 meetings with 40+ in attendance for each.

 $\circ$  The initiative for an alternative worship service to be revisited once a new pastor has been installed.

 $\circ$  Pastor search status: The Pastoral Search Team will meet with a candidate mid-April. Updates will be provided as available.
