What Christians Can Do About Antisemitism

We welcome Rabbi Michael Panitz to speak on the subject of "What Christians can do about Antisemitism" at 10:00 am May 15 in the Baraca Room. In recent months and years, with increased attacks on synagogues in Pittsburgh, Penn., Poway, Calif., Colleyville, Tex., and other communities, the need to push back at the advancing tide of antisemitic intolerance is growing more and more urgent. For Jews, remaining visibly engaged in the work of building a better society demonstrates our shared vital contributions to our community. This involves men and women of good faith, who belong to different faith communities, working together.

Rabbi Panitz has spoken to many Christian congregations in the area and even as a guest speaker at a SCC deacons' annual dinner. At his kind invitation, several deacons and their spouses later visited his synagogue for a Shabbat service.

Rabbi at Temple Israel in Norfolk since 1992, he is an adjunct professor of History and Religion at Virginian Wesleyan University and adjunct professor of World Languages & Cultures at Old Dominion University. He received his Master of Arts and Ph.D. in Jewish Studies from Jewish Theological Seminary and has taught at the College of William and Mary, the Jewish Theological Seminary of America, St. Peter's College, and Queens College. Dr. Panitz has authored several scholarly publications and is the recipient of the L. D. Britt Community Builders' Award of Eastern Virginia Medical School and the Inter-group Builders Award from the National Conference for Community and Justice, among other honors. He is married to Sheila Panitz, and they have three children and two grandchildren.
