#### **Board of Deacons Report:** October 11, 2023 Meeting

- Prior to the meeting, Dan Cooke from All Saints Presbyterian Church of Suffolk
  addressed the Deacons and reported their attendance has doubled and proposed
  having a second Sunday service as well as having their Wednesday service every week
  instead of every other week. An additional request was made to use our church for the
  ordination of their pastor, to take place on or around January 12, 2024. Finally, Mr.
  Cooke offered the services of their men to assist with maintenance of our building and
  grounds.
- The Food Ministry/Pantry reports serving 18-20 people on each outing. In addition, the ministry is considering providing a limited number of Thanksgiving meal baskets.
- The Board approved the following items:
  - a. November's mission (yellow envelope) will be the Church Family Assistance Fund.
  - b. To continue providing rice for a local Thanksgiving event.
  - c. To use Food Ministry resources to periodically provide groceries to a couple in our congregation dealing with medical bills and transportation issues.
  - d. Approved the request by All Saints Presbyterian Church of Suffolk for a second service on Sunday at 2pm and Wednesday service every week instead of every other week. These additional services will begin in January 2024.
