

#### The Board of Deacons Reports.....from the September 14, 2023 Meeting

- \*An open session was held prior to the meeting and approximately twelve people (non-board members) attended, expressing concerns and/or asking questions about the current proposed revisions to the SCC constitution (currently laying on the table prior to the vote at the October Conference.) If you have not already done so, please pick up a copy of the proposed changes for your own review.
- \*A report on Missions was given and the monthly yellow envelope for October was voted to go towards "Sheltering the Homeless" this winter. It was reported that CAPS may or may not have a program and that it is hoped there will be a hotel program again this year. The donations to this SCC fund may be used for either of these two outreaches or for any other program that may occur to shelter the homeless in Suffolk.
- \*A report on our "Food Ministries" mission was given. The logistics of Tuesday distribution have been changed slightly in that guests now come to the North side of the building and food is passed through the doorway (of the children's department) to the individuals on the 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, and 4<sup>th</sup> Tuesdays, 3:00-4:00 p.m. Eggs, bread and meats are also being offered in addition to a bag of canned goods and other food items. 16-20 people are coming each week. Our church also has a team that prepares a meal at the Salvation Army every other month.
- \*Thank you to the congregation for your generous donations of school supplies. 6 children received all of their needed supplies and extras were donated to Mack Benn and Elephant's Fork Elementary Schools.
- \*The Board voted to host another Town Hall type event on November 5 to further discuss and start to act upon our areas of focus we defined last year... helping the homeless, working with our schools, a possible alternative service and increasing fellowship and promoting growth within our church. Deacons, with the help of the Transition Team, will host this covered dish dinner and program.
- \*It was reported that the Pastoral Search Committee is still hard at work on securing our next pastor.
- \*Looking ahead....plans are being made to offer a Pastor's Class for candidates for baptism in our church. This will likely occur in winter, 2024.

October's Yellow Envelope Mission: Sheltering the Homeless

Last year Federal assistance provided the "Winter Shelter" program to house people in local hotels. (Cheryl Griffin was in charge of implementing this program in Suffolk.) The Salvation Army provided shelter in the past year. Suffolk Christian Church generously provided food for those in both of the programs last year along with other groups.

However, it is still being worked out how the coming season will look. Please pray for our homeless not only for the coming winter but every day! We know we want to be a part of this effort in whatever way we can. Therefore, it is the intention of the Board of Deacons that the funds collected in October be used for the sheltering of the homeless people in the coming cold, however that shapes up to be. We thank you for your generous support and prayers for this mission.
