Special called Church Conference

The City of Suffolk is proposing to acquire a 20' permanent public utility easement from our Church. The Board of Trustees has reviewed this acquisition and has reached a settlement agreement pending the approval of the congregation. State law requires this approval and our Constitution states action must be taken at a conference meeting of the church members. The Board of Deacons has approved the calling of a church conference on September 8, 2024, immediately following the 11:00 AM Worship Service for the purpose of presenting the details of the acquisition and a congregational vote.
