#### 2 Thessalonians 1:3-4

Remember to begin your study early in the week so that you have time to really think (and keep thinking) about the passage without being rushed.

#### ❖ Day 1

Read 2 Thessalonians 1:3-4.

For these lessons, the sermon text is provided in a format that visually helps display the structure of the paragraph or section of text. The main verbs are underlined. Commands are double-underlined. Generally, the main indicative clauses remain to the left, and the other clauses are either directly underneath when they have equal priority to what comes before, or are tabbed to the right when the clause supports, develops, or draws a conclusion from a neighboring clause.

3 We ought always to give thanks

to God for you, brethren, as is *only* fitting, because your faith is greatly enlarged, and the love of each one of you toward one another grows *ever* greater;

**4** therefore, we ourselves <u>speak proudly</u> of you among the churches of God for your perseverance and faith

in the midst of all your persecutions and afflictions which you endure.

❖ Day 3 Read 2 Thessalonians 1:3-4 again.			
16. What context does the faith and perseverance of the Thessalonians shine through?			
17. Are these persecutions temporary? How do you know?			
18. What are these persecutions? Is there any description of this affliction in either 1 or 2 Thessalonians that you can find?			
19. How does this passage inform the way you give thanks for things beyond your own life among the saints?			

20. How does the gratitude of Paul and his coworkers for other believers in other churches inform the way we should know or interact with other gospel preaching churches?
21. Summarize the main idea of these verses in 21 words or less.

In preparation for Sunday, pray in thankfulness for the faith in and love of Christ you see in believers in and outside of our church. Pray with gratitude for the faith of those you see who endure persecution for their faith. Pray for the persecuted church that they would persevere in their affliction and God would be magnified through their faith. Pray for opportunities to proudly speak of faithful believers for the glory of God and encouragement of others.
