## 2 Thessalonians 2:3-5

Remember to begin your study early in the week so that you have time to really think (and keep thinking) about the passage without being rushed.

### ❖ Day 1

Review 2 Thessalonians 1 through 2:2 and read carefully 2 Thessalonians 2:3-5.

For these lessons, the sermon text is provided in a format that visually helps display the structure of the paragraph or section of text. The main verbs are underlined. Commands are double-underlined. Generally, the main indicative clauses remain to the left, and the other clauses are either directly underneath when they have equal priority to what comes before, or are tabbed to the right when the clause supports, develops, or draws a conclusion from a neighboring clause.

#### 3 Let no one in any way deceive you,

for it <u>will not come</u> unless the apostasy <u>comes</u> first, and the man of lawlessness is revealed, the son of destruction, 4 who <u>opposes</u> and <u>exalts</u> himself above every so-called god

or object of worship,

so that he <u>takes</u> his seat in the temple of God, displaying himself as being God.

that while I was still with you, I was telling you these things?

- 2. Why is the warning of these verses being given? What made the Thessalonians susceptible to deception?
- 3. What is the noun being referred to by "it" in verse three?
- 4. What two things must precede the coming of Christ according to verse 3?

Review the letter and read 2 Thess. 2:3-5 again.

- 15. Why is it important to protect ourselves from false viewpoints about the end times?

- 17. Why might the Thessalonians have forgotten the message/teaching he previously spoke to them when he was with them?
- 18. What impact would it have on the Thessalonians if they were deceived outside of the viewpoint of this passage?
- 19. What is the value in *remembering right teaching* that is apparent in these verses? What does this inform us about the need for consistent teaching of the truth?
- 20. What is the main point/idea of these verses? How would you summarize it into one sentence?

In preparation for Sunday, pray through this passage for

- For the coming of Christ.
- That the truth of God's Word would be upheld and that you would not be deceived by false teaching.
- For those who are deceived by false teaching and who have drifted into apostasy even now. Pray they would return to Christ before it is too late.
- Pray for opportunities to share the gospel and that the reality of Christ's return would prompt you to be faithful in evangelism.
