#### Hebrews 7:20-28

#### ❖ DAY 1

#### Read Hebrews 7:20-28

For these lessons, the sermon text is provided in a format that visually helps display the structure of the paragraph or section of text. The main verbs are underlined. Commands are double-underlined. Generally, the main indicative clauses remain to the left, and the other clauses are either directly underneath when they have equal priority to what comes before, or are tabbed to the right when the clause supports, develops, or draws a conclusion from a neighboring clause.

20 And inasmuch as it was not without an oath

21 (for they indeed became priests without an oath,

but He with an oath through the One who said to Him,

"THE LORD HAS SWORN

AND WILL NOT CHANGE HIS MIND,

'YOU ARE A PRIEST FOREVER'");

22 so much the more also Jesus has become the guarantee of a better covenant.

23 The former priests, on the one hand,

existed in greater numbers

because they were prevented by death from continuing,

24 but Jesus, on the other hand,

because He continues forever,

holds His priesthood permanently.

Therefore He is able also to save forever

those who draw near to God through Him,

since He always lives to make intercession for them.

**26** For it was fitting for us to have such a high priest,

holy,

innocent,

undefiled,

separated from sinners

and exalted above the heavens;

who does not need daily,

like those high priests,

to offer up sacrifices,

first for His own sins

and then for the *sins* of the people,
because this He did once for all
when He offered up Himself.

28		For the Law appoints men as high priests who are weak, but the word of the oath, which came after the Law, appoints a Son, made perfect forever.
