avid was an experienced killer. As a shepherd, he killed wild animals. When he was a young man, he killed Goliath on a battlefield. God used David to get rid of creatures that were harmful to David's sheep, and a giant who desired to destroy God's people. You can imagine how hard it was for David to resist the temptation to use deadly force to take revenge on King Saul. After all, King Saul had tried to kill David first. Why did David refuse to react with violence toward the king?

First of all, David understood the difference between war and revenge. War is when you are fighting to protect something valuable. Revenge is when someone has made you mad and you decide to get even. It's easy to seek revenge when people do or say things to hurt you. You want them to feel the same pain they inflicted on you. David the warrior was not afraid to cause pain on the battlefield, but he was not about to take revenge on God's chosen king. David knew he had to be a peacemaker.

One night, while Saul was sleeping in his tent, David crept inside. He resisted the temptation from one of his friends to kill Saul. David knew it was more important to honor God than to seek revenge. He simply took Saul's spear and water jug. He later showed these to Saul to let him know how easily he could have killed him. David talked to Saul and told him that God would be the one who would judge the king's evil actions.

The Bible says, "Forget about the wrong things people do to you. You must not try to get even. Love your neighbor as you love yourself. I am the Lord." (Leviticus 19:18) David chose the peaceful way. He chose God's way. On several occasions, David resisted the mighty temptation of revenge and instead chose to honor and obey God. When people say or do things to hurt you, be a peacemaker like David. Do it God's way. Don't get mad, get peace, and BE HAPPY!!!


