magine that your brothers and sisters threw you into a big hole and then sold you to some dudes riding camels. That's what you call "a really bad day" and "a family with some big problems". The sad thing is, many families have big problems just like this family. God didn't create families to fight and hate, but rather to love and help each other. Family is something to celebrate, not hate. Take a look at the rest of the story about the boy in the hole and you'll get the idea. Joseph was the favorite child of his father, Jacob. He even gave Joseph a beautiful coat of many colors. (Mistake #1: Parents shouldn't play favorites.) When Joseph started telling his brothers about his dreams of them bowing down to him, things got a little sticky. (Mistake #2: Never tell your siblings they will bow at your feet.) Jealous rage filled the hearts of Joseph's brothers. (Mistake #3: No matter what, avoid jealous rages.) They tossed him into the hole, and then (you guessed it) sold him to some dudes on camels who then sold him as a slave in Egypt to a man named Potiphar. You can read the whole story in Genesis, chapters 37-46, but for now, let's skip ahead. Many years later, Joseph, who stayed faithful to God, ended up second in command of all Egypt. (Right thing

#1: Be faithful to God even when things go wrong.) Believe it or not, a dream about a famine (no rain, no food) got him there. Joseph required everyone in Egypt to save lots of grain, so when the famine came, there was plenty of food stored up. When his brothers ran out of grain, they came to Egypt looking for food. Who did they run in to? Joseph. After everyone had cried and said they were sorry, Joseph and his brothers celebrated. (Right thing #2: Be forgiving.) Jacob and the rest of the family soon joined Joseph in Egypt where they had lots to eat and many good times together. (Right thing

#3: Eat lots of meals together.)

God has given mothers a special place in the raising of their children. It is often mothers who spend countless hours caring and praying for their children. The book of Samuel tells the story of a mother who should be an inspiration to all moms. Hannah desperately wanted a child. She prayed and asked for God's help. A promise was made to the Lord. If Hannah had a son, she would dedicate the child to the Lord. God answered Hannah's prayers, and she soon gave birth to a boy named Samuel. When Samuel was old enough, Hannah took him to the tabernacle to live and serve God. There is no doubt Hannah loved her son, and prayed for him often. 
