2. Pauls' pattern was evangelism, establishment of churches, equipping leaders, and then entrusting the ministry to others. In what ways do you see this replicated in churches today? In what ways do you see churches falling short of this pattern? Explain your answer.
3. Of the three ways to be practically involved in missions: prayer, provision, and participation, which do you do best? Which is an area for improvement?
4. If you were able to attend the Secret Church service on Sunday night, what were your impressions of how Christians worship in oppressed nations? If you were not able to attend, talk about what you can imagine Christianity would look like for persecuted Christians.
5. As you consider the sermon as a whole, what was the most impactful point that was made? Why do you think this point spoke to you personally? Explain your answer.
6. What is one point of action that you can implement this week as a result of this passage and the sermon preached?
