Scripture: Colossians 3:17, 21

UNPACKING THE GOSPEL IN THE BIBLE:

Read Colossians 3:17, 21

What is the goal or purpose of parenting as a Christian?

- Our goal is not simply to raise good, moral kids or kids that are completely self-sufficient members of society.
- The point of Christian parenting is to point our kids to Jesus. We cannot save our kids but
 we can definitely shape the environment for the Holy Spirit to produce salvation and
 godliness in their lives.

How do you encourage (not provoke) your kids to Jesus?

It starts with you. Are you finding your value and worth in who Christ says that you are, or is
your worth being shaped by your career or your kids? Your kids will see what matters
supremely to you and it will have a massive impact on them.

What is the result of making your kids your supreme worth in this world?

If they are your source of things that only God is really the source for, then they will think
they are God. Making your children your whole world, puts the weight of the whole world
on your children

LIVING OUT THE GOSPEL IN MY EVERYDAY LIFE:
