Scripture: Exodus 20:15; Luke 23:32-43

Bottom Line: Our response to the 8th Commandment is not am I thief, but which

thief will I be? Will I mock Jesus or will I confess and believe?

## INTRODUCTION/ICEBREAKER:

As children we have the propensity to make decisions and not think about the consequences. Rob's sermon contained a story about the first item he remembers stealing when he was in the first grade. The item was a highly coveted Berenstain Bear's book. What is your first memory of stealing? What were the consequences?

## **UNPACKING THE GOSPEL IN THE BIBLE:**

#### Read Exodus 20:15

- 1) Why do you believe "stealing" is included in the commandments? (Stealing goes against the very thing God calls us to do with our lives as Christians. We are a people called to serve and give generously to others as he has done for us).
- 2) What makes a person a thief? (definition: a person who steals another person's property)

### Read Luke 23:32-43

- 1) Describe the difference between the thieves response to Jesus as they were crucified together?
- 2) How does Jesus respond to the thief who turns to him and believes?
- 3) What does this reveal about God's radical grace?
- 4) In what areas of your life and your struggles are you not believing in the same grace from God?

# LIVING OUT THE GOSPEL IN MY EVERYDAY LIFE:

- 1) **Road Map:** How does a life free of guilt over stealing or free of longing for certain "things" bring freedom and make much of Jesus to others?
- 2) **Mirror:** How does the 8th commandment "expose" our hearts? (shows that we are sinful people in need of a Savior)
- 3) **Window:** What does the 8th Commandment as Jesus interprets it reveal about God? (He is a GENEROUS Father who has given us all that we will ever need. He has given us Himself.)
