# **CORE TEXT**

ROMANS 5:12-21 (ESV)

12 Therefore, just as sin came into the world through one man, and death through sin, and so death spread to all men because all sinned - 13 for sin indeed was in the world before the law was given, but sin is not counted where there is no law. 14 Yet death reigned from Adam to Moses, even over those whose sinning was not like the transgression of Adam, who was a type of the one who was to come. 15 But the free gift is not like the trespass. For if many died through one man's trespass, much more have the grace of God and the free gift by the grace of that one man Jesus Christ abounded for many. 16 And the free gift is not like the result of that one man's sin. For the judgment following one trespass brought condemnation, but the free gift following many trespasses brought justification. 17 For if, because of one man's trespass, death reigned through that one man, much more will those who receive the abundance of grace and the free gift of righteousness reign in life through the one man Jesus Christ.

18 Therefore, as one trespass led to condemnation for all men, so one act of righteousness leads to justification and life for all men. 19 For as by the one man's disobedience the many were made sinners, so by the one man's obedience the many will be made righteous. 20 Now the law came in to increase the trespass, but where sin increased, grace abounded all the more, 21 so that, as sin reigned in death, grace also might reign through righteousness leading to eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord.




# **ICEBREAKER**


# **DISCUSSION QUESTIONS**

Have one or more people read the text out loud.

- 1. What kind of a car do you like to drive? What is definitely not your type of car? What kind of shows do you like to watch? What is definitely not your type of show to watch?
- 2. Have you ever heard about "typology" before?
  Can you recall any other times in Scripture where it's used?
- 3. What do you recall were the similarities and differences between the First Adam and the Last Adam?
- 4. How do you respond to the idea that sin is a powerful and pervasive influence in your life?
- 5. We looked at how the idea of "sin" is really counter-cultural in our present day. Do you think there could be value in talking about sin? Why or why not?
- 6. What difference does it make that God's grace has "super-abounded" for you? How should that affect the way in which you extend grace to others?
- 7. Do you have any special plans or rituals for Holy Week?

# DEEPER IN THE WORD

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# DEEPER IN THE WORD, PT. 1

**ROMANS 5:12-21** 

Have one or more people read the text out loud before you start.

- 1. In this section, Paul uses an interpretive method called typology (see v. 14). This was a common method used by the New Testament authors. It saw persons or events in the Old Testament as foreshadows or patterns of persons or events in the New Testament. In this section, Adam is a "type" of Christ. Compare verse 14 with 1 Corinthians 15:22, 45-48. How does Paul refer to Jesus?
- 2. Looking through the entire passage, how are Adam and Jesus alike? How are they different?
- 3. What is the "free gift" that Paul refers to throughout this passage?
- 4. What was Adam's trespass (see Genesis 2:16-17 and 3:4-5)?
- 5. Paul uses the term "reign" several times in this passage. What is the difference between the two types of reign? Who is reigning and what does it include?
- 6. When did sin and death enter the world? How are these two realities related?
- 7. What did Paul mean when he said, "the law came to increase the trespass" (v. 20)?
- 8. Notice the number of times Paul uses the phrases "much more" and "abound." What does this teach us about the difference between the First Adam and the Last Adam? How is this good news for us?
