A BASIC AGENDA



These are the basic elements in every Home Group meeting. You have the option of doing either the "message reflection" or the "deeper in the Word" sections. You likely won't have time to do both, especially if your group likes to share. Remember, the goal of your group is to build transformed lives, not to keep an agenda. Pay attention to what the Holy Spirit is doing. If you need to change things up, go for it.

ICEBREAKER

Take ten minutes to reconnect and get to know each other.

MESSAGE DISCUSSION

Discuss the teaching from the Sunday message. Hopefully, you've all seen it!

DEEPER IN THE WORD

Dig into the core scripture passage from the weekend teaching.

REFLECTION

Talk about the meaning of the text and how it personally applies.

PRAYER

Set aside time to share needs and pray for group members.

CORE TEXT

ROMANS 2:12-29 (ESV)

12 For all who have sinned without the law will also perish without the law, and all who have sinned under the law will be judged by the law. 13 For it is not the hearers of the law who are righteous before God, but the doers of the law who will be justified. 14 For when Gentiles, who do not have the law, by nature do what the law requires, they are a law to themselves, even though they do not have the law. 15 They show that the work of the law is written on their hearts, while their conscience also bears witness, and their conflicting thoughts accuse or even excuse them 16 on that day when, according to my gospel, God judges the secrets of men by Christ Jesus.

17 But if you call yourself a Jew and rely on the law and boast in God 18 and know his will and approve what is excellent, because you are instructed from the law; 19 and if you are sure that you yourself are a guide to the blind, a light to those who are in darkness, 20 an instructor of the foolish, a teacher of children, having in the law the embodiment of knowledge and truth— 21 you then who teach others, do you not teach yourself? While you preach against stealing, do you steal? 22 You who say that one must not commit adultery, do you commit adultery? You who abhor idols, do you rob temples? 23 You who boast in the law dishonor God by breaking the law. 24 For, as it is written, "The name of God is blasphemed among the Gentiles because of you."

25 For circumcision indeed is of value if you obey the law, but if you break the law, your circumcision becomes uncircumcision. 26 So, if a man who is uncircumcised keeps the precepts of the law, will not his uncircumcision be regarded as circumcision? 27 Then he who is physically uncircumcised but keeps the law will condemn you who have the written code and circumcision but break the law. 28 For no one is a Jew who is merely one outwardly, nor is circumcision outward and physical. 29 But a Jew is one inwardly, and circumcision is a matter of the heart, by the Spirit, not by the letter. His praise is not from man but from God.




ICEBREAKER

If your group doesn't know each other well, or if you've been apart for a while, an icebreaker is a great way to assist you in getting reacquainted. Icebreakers also 'break the ice' and help people engage in conversation.

When you share information about yourself with others, and they accept you for who you are, it builds trust. This trust leads to greater transparency and openness. If you want some icebreaker ideas, check out the resources at the end of this book.

WEEKEND MESSAGE


DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

Have one or more people read the text out loud.

- 1. Have you ever walked out onto a frozen lake before? Have you ever fallen through the ice?
- 2. What arguments did Paul use to dismantle the Jewish believers' overconfidence in their right standing with God? How have you seen people you know use similar arguments?
- 3. Why is the advice, "just follow your heart" not great advice? How would Paul have responded to this advice?
- 4. How have you relied on your learning or your labels to prop yourself up?
- 5. "The discovery of weakness is a tremendous gift to the follower of Jesus." When has this proven true for you?
- 6. How have you responded to the challenge to receive a fresh outpouring of the Holy Spirit in your life?

DEEPER IN THE WORD

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
DEEPER IN THE WORD, PT. 1

ROMANS 2:12-29

Have one or more people read the text out loud before you start.

In these verses, when Paul speaks about the "law" he is referring to the Torah. This was the Law given to Israel at Mount Sinai, which showed them how to live faithfully within the covenant.

- 1. In verse 12, who are those who have "sinned without the Law" and who are are those "under the Law?" How will they be judged differently?
- 2. At first glance, Paul *seems* to be saying in verses 12-14 that the Gentiles can be justified for their obedience. These verses need to be understood in their context. How does the larger context of verses 15-29 shed light on what Paul is saying? See also Romans 3:23 for Paul's summary statement of everything he has written up to that point.
- 3. How will Gentiles be held accountable since they do not have the Law (verses 14-16)?
- 4. In verse 15 Pauls says that the "work of the law" is written on Gentiles' hearts. How is this different than the actual Law (Torah) being written on their hearts?
- 5. Why does Paul tell the Jewish believers that they should not rely on the Law to save them (verses 17-23)?
- 6. In verse 24, Paul is quoting from Isaiah 52:5 and echoing Ezekiel 36:20. He is repeating a common critique of Israel that they had failed at their job of being a light to the nations (Isaiah 42:6). How does this reinforce Paul's admonition to the Jewish believers that they shouldn't rely on the Law?
- 7. For the Jews, circumcision was the sign of their covenant with the Lord. In verses 25-29, what value does circumcision have apart from keeping the Law? What does Paul say is true circumcision?
- 8. What does Paul mean when he says "circumcision is a matter of the heart, but the Spirit, not by the letter." Read Ezekiel 36:26-27 and Jeremiah 31:31-34. What does God promise in these verses?
