A BASIC AGENDA



These are the basic elements in every Home Group meeting. You have the option of doing either the "message reflection" or the "deeper in the Word" sections. You likely won't have time to do both, especially if your group likes to share. Remember, the goal of your group is to build transformed lives, not to keep an agenda. Pay attention to what the Holy Spirit is doing. If you need to change things up, go for it.

ICEBREAKER

Take ten minutes to reconnect and get to know each other.

MESSAGE DISCUSSION

Discuss the teaching from the Sunday message. Hopefully, you've all seen it!

DEEPER IN THE WORD

Dig into the core scripture passage from the weekend teaching.

REFLECTION

Talk about the meaning of the text and how it personally applies.

PRAYER

Set aside time to share needs and pray for group members.

CORE TEXT

ROMANS 3:1-20 (ESV)

Then what advantage has the Jew? Or what is the value of circumcision? 2 Much in every way. To begin with, the Jews were entrusted with the oracles of God. 3 What if some were unfaithful? Does their faithlessness nullify the faithfulness of God? 4 By no means! Let God be true though every one were a liar, as it is written, "That you may be justified in your words, and prevail when you are judged."5 But if our unrighteousness serves to show the righteousness of God, what shall we say? That God is unrighteous to inflict wrath on us? (I speak in a human way.) 6 By no means! For then how could God judge the world? 7 But if through my lie God's truth abounds to his glory, why am I still being condemned as a sinner? 8 And why not do evil that good may come?—as some people slanderously charge us with saying. Their condemnation is just.

9 What then? Are we Jews any better off? No, not at all. For we have already charged that all, both Jews and Greeks, are under sin, 10 as it is written:

"None is righteous, no, not one;

- 11 no one understands;
 - no one seeks for God.
- 12 All have turned aside; together they have become worthless;

no one does good,

not even one."

13 "Their throat is an open grave;

they use their tongues to deceive."

"The venom of asps is under their lips."

- 14 "Their mouth is full of curses and bitterness."
- 15 "Their feet are swift to shed blood;
- 16 in their paths are ruin and misery,
- 17 and the way of peace they have not known."
- 18 "There is no fear of God before their eyes."

19 Now we know that whatever the law says it speaks to those who are under the law, so that every mouth may be stopped, and the whole world may be held accountable to God. 20 For by works of the law no human being will be justified in his sight, since through the law comes knowledge of sin.




ICEBREAKER

WEEKEND MESSAGE


DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

Have one or more people read the text out loud.

- 1. Why would a first-century, Jewish Christian in Rome have problems with what Paul has said so far in Romans?
- 2. What is the 'righteousness of God'? Why do you think it is so important that Paul explain how the righteousness of God is revealed in the gospel?
- 3. Do people today question the righteousness of God? How is this similar or different from the questions those in Rome were asking?
- 4. What objections might people have to the idea that the whole world is "under sin?" How would you respond to those objections?
- 5. Rob explained a number of "self-salvation" strategies that we use to justify ourselves before God (comparison, rationalization, outweighing). Which of these do you sometimes use? Are there other strategies you have used?
- 6. "People are the problem. God himself became the solution." When we consider God's gracious response to our guilt, how should we respond? How might it change your affections? Your behaviour? Your relationships?
- 7. Have someone read 2 Corinthians 5:21 and 1 Peter 2:24. Spend some time in worship and thanksgiving for God's grace.

DEEPER IN THE WORD

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DEEPER IN THE WORD, PT. 1


ROMANS 3:1-20

Have one or more people read the text out loud before you start.

NOTE: In these verses, when Paul speaks about the "law" he is referring to the Torah. This was the Law given to Israel at Mount Sinai, which showed them how to live faithfully within the covenant.

- 1. In the previous chapter, Paul explained that having the Law or being circumcised would not guarantee that a Jew would be in right standing with God. What advantage then do Jews have according to verses 1-2?
- 2. What do we learn about God's faithfulness in verses 3-4? How are you encouraged by this?
- 3. In verses 5-8 Paul dispels a ridiculous argument against God's righteousness. What's the argument and how does Paul respond?
- 4. What do you think Paul meant when he said that "we have already charged that all, both Jews and Greeks are under sin" (v.9)? How is being under sin different from practicing sin (See also Romans 6:6,12)? Why do you think Paul uses the legal term "charged"?
- 5. In verses 9-18 Paul demonstrates the totality of sin's controlling influence.

 Look through these verses and identify how sin touches our lives in various ways. Why did Paul call upon the Jewish Scriptures to prosecute humanity?
- 6. The phrase, "that every mouth may be stopped" (v.19) comes from first-century law court proceedings. A defendant was allowed to speak in her own defence. When they were finished, they would cover their mouth with their hand as a sign that they were finished. If they continued talking, when clearly they were guilty, a court official would hit them in the mouth so that they would stop speaking. What point is Paul making about the Law when he says that every mouth may be stopped?
- 7. What role does the Law play according to verse 20? What are the benefits of this? The drawbacks?
