A BASIC AGENDA



These are the basic elements in every Home Group meeting. You have the option of doing either the "message reflection" or the "deeper in the Word" sections. You likely won't have time to do both, especially if your group likes to share. Remember, the goal of your group is to build transformed lives, not to keep an agenda. Pay attention to what the Holy Spirit is doing. If you need to change things up, go for it.

ICEBREAKER

Take ten minutes to reconnect and get to know each other.

MESSAGE DISCUSSION

Discuss the teaching from the Sunday message. Hopefully, you've all seen it!

DEEPER IN THE WORD

Dig into the core scripture passage from the weekend teaching.

REFLECTION

Talk about the meaning of the text and how it personally applies.

PRAYER

Set aside time to share needs and pray for group members.

CORE TEXT

ROMANS 4:1-12 (ESV)

What then shall we say was gained by Abraham, our forefather according to the flesh? 2 For if Abraham was justified by works, he has something to boast about, but not before God. 3 For what does the Scripture say? "Abraham believed God, and it was counted to him as righteousness." 4 Now to the one who works, his wages are not counted as a gift but as his due. 5 And to the one who does not work but believes in him who justifies the ungodly, his faith is counted as righteousness, 6 just as David also speaks of the blessing of the one to whom God counts righteousness apart from works:

7 "Blessed are those whose lawless deeds are forgiven,
and whose sins are covered;

8 blessed is the man against whom the Lord will not count his sin."

9 Is this blessing then only for the circumcised, or also for the uncircumcised? For we say that faith was counted to Abraham as righteousness. 10 How then was it counted to him? Was it before or after he had been circumcised? It was not after, but before he was circumcised. 11 He received the sign of circumcision as a seal of the righteousness that he had by faith while he was still uncircumcised. The purpose was to make him the father of all who believe without being circumcised, so that righteousness would be counted to them as well, 12 and to make him the father of the circumcised who are not merely circumcised but who also walk in the footsteps of the faith that our father Abraham had before he was circumcised.



ICEBREAKER

If your group doesn't know each other well, or if you've been apart for a while, an icebreaker is a great way to assist you in getting reacquainted. Icebreakers also 'break the ice' and help people engage in conversation.

When you share information about yourself with others, and they accept you for who you are, it builds trust. This trust leads to greater transparency and openness. If you want some icebreaker ideas, check out the resources at the end of this book.

WEEKEND MESSAGE

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

Have one or more people read the text out loud.

1. Have you ever made a big mistake that someone else had to pay for? When you reflect on that experience what thoughts or feelings surface?
2. For the past two weeks, we have talked about justification (having a right standing before God). Why do you think this is an important theme in Romans? How important is this topic for your faith?
3. Why does Paul point to Abraham to demonstrate that we are justified by faith and not works? How does he use Abraham to explain this?
4. David chose to step into God's blessing rather than continuing to be burdened. What was the blessing he sought?
5. Why does it matter WHEN Abraham was justified? If he was justified before he was circumcised, what is the implication for the whole world? What is the implication for you personally?
6. "There's a very real danger when we try to graduate from the gospel." Agree or disagree? What's the danger?
7. How have Christians tried to 'add to Jesus' in order to ensure their right standing with God?
8. What would it look like to 'broaden the circle' in your life (or group!) to welcome people into the family of God? How can the church continue to do this?

DEEPER IN THE WORD

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DEEPER IN THE WORD, PT. 1

ROMANS 4:1-12

Have one or more people read the text out loud before you start.

1. How does the theme of Romans 4:1-12 follow naturally from what Paul has been discussing in Romans 3:21-31?
2. Who does it sound like Paul is speaking to in this passage? Why is Abraham an important figure to this audience?
3. What is the point that Paul is making in verse 3? What is the backstory of Abraham's decision (see Genesis 12:1-4 and 15:1-6)?
4. Paul continues his point by quoting King David. Read Psalm 32:1-5. What was David experiencing and how did this enhance the meaning behind, "*Blessed* are those..."?
5. In verses 9-12 Paul is presenting an argument about the timing of Abraham's circumcision. Abraham's faith decision took place in Genesis 15 and his circumcision took place in Genesis 17. What is the point that Paul is making?
6. What is circumcision (v. 11)? Do believers need to be circumcised today? If circumcision was the seal of the old covenant, what is the seal of the new covenant (see Ephesians 1:13-14)?
7. What is the biggest implication of 'righteousness apart from circumcision' as it pertains to the family of Abraham (v. 11b)? How controversial would this have been in Paul's day?
