- [18] Luke 17:1-6 | What does Jesus say about a person who encourages another to sin? Why does He say this?
- [19] Luke 17:1-6 | Reflect on v.4. Why is forgiveness so crucial to the Christian life? How can you actively apply Jesus' teaching this week?
- [20] Luke 17:7-19 | All ten lepers had faith in Jesus to ask for healing and obeyed him before they had proof of healing. What was unique about the Samaritan's response to Jesus?
- [21] Luke 17:20-37 | What part does the expectation of Jesus' second coming play in your life? How do you think you might live differently if you were waiting daily for His return?
- [22] Luke 17:20-37 | In what sense was the Kingdom (His sovereign rule, His presence, His blessings) already among Jesus' hearers? In what sense is it within each of us individually?
- [23] Review your notes from the week. What have you learned about the character of Jesus & how to follow Him?

WEEK 5

Sunday, February 24th

- [25] Luke 18:1-8 | Why does the judge finally give justice to the widow? How does this parable encourage you to not lose heart when you are tempted to give up praying?
- [26] Luke 18:9-14 | Contrast the Pharisee's and tax collector's attitudes in prayer.
- [27] Luke 18:15-16 | What does it mean to receive the Kingdom of God like a child?
- [28] Review your notes from the week. What have you learned about the character of Jesus & how to follow Him?

WEEK 1

Sunday, January 27th

- [Feb 1] Luke 14:34-35 | How is a would-be disciple who decides he cannot bear the cost, like salt that loses its saltiness?
- [2] Review your notes from the week. What have you learned about the character of Jesus & how to follow Him?

WEEK 2

Sunday, February 3rd

- [4] Luke 15:1-32 | What complaint prompted Jesus to tell these three parables (v.2). How does this help you understand the message and purpose of them?
- [5] Luke 15:1-8 | What does God do and how does He feel when He finds His lost one?
- [6] Luke 15:9-10 | You are of great value to God; He comes after you when you are lost! Respond in praise to God for this truth.
- [7] Luke 15:11-24 | What does this parable teach us about true repentance? What brought the son to repentance?
- [8] Luke 15:25-32 | What response does this parable ask for from sinners? From "Pharisees"? From you?
- [9] Review your notes from the week. What have you learned about the character of Jesus & how to follow Him?

WEEK 3

Sunday, February 10th

- [11] Luke 16:1-31 | Do the lessons in this chapter apply to possessions besides money? If so, how? If not, why not?
- [12] Luke 16:1-13 | Jesus commends a particular character trait of a good disciple: faithful stewardship. Why should we be faithful with what we have in this world, according to v.10-13?
- [13] Luke 16:14-18 | Reflect on the spiritual dimension of money. What is it about money that makes it a "God-substitute"?
- [14] Luke 16:19-31 | How could the rich man have attained the blessings Lazarus received (v.29, 31)?
- [15] Reread all of Luke 16 and ask God to impress on you the urgency of these parables. What ways might He be urging you to act upon the lessons in these parables this week?
- [16] Review your notes from the week. What have you learned about the character of Jesus & how to follow Him?
