I. The Trials of the Christian Life (vs. 2-4)

A. INEVITABLE "when"

- 1. All of life is a trial
- 2. Scripture promises trials for Christians
 - 1 Pet. 4:12
 - 2 Tim. 3:12
 - Acts 14:22
 - 1 Thess. 3:3
 - John 16:33
 - Luke 21:16b-17

B. VARIABLE "various kinds"

- 1. Trials come in all shapes and sizes:
- 2. Trials in James:
 - Poverty or Riches (we'll see this in 1:9-11)
 - Persecution (2:6-7)
 - Knowledge
 - $\circ~$ Knowing of a need means we must meet it (2:15-17)
 - $\circ~$ Knowing enough to teach, means more strict judgment (3:1)
 - $\circ~$ Knowing of a moral obligation, means we must meet it (4:17)
 - Suffering for the faith (5:7-11)
 - Taming the Tongue (3:1-9) can do good & bad
 - Our energy and ambitions/plans tempt us (4:13-16)
 - Illness of body or mind tries us (5:13-18)

C. REJOICEABLE "count it all joy"

- 1. A repeated pattern in Scripture.
 - 1 Pet. 4:13
 - Rom. 5:3-5
 - Matt. 5:11-12
 - 2 Cor. 7:4b
 - Acts 5:40-41
 - 1 Pet. 1:5-7
- 2. Should we be "Joyful" in Trial?
- 3. What is joy

D. VALUABLE (or productive)

TRIALS \rightarrow seen as a TEST \rightarrow produce ENDURANCE \rightarrow leads to MATURITY \rightarrow leads to PROVEN GENUINENESS OF FAITH \rightarrow gives ASSURANCE & JOY (1 Pet. 1, 2 Pet. 1, 1 Jn. 3:19-21, & Rom. 5:3-5)

II. The Wisdom {for Trials} Needed (vs. 5-8)

- A. MAN Natural reactions to trials
 - <u>Guilt</u> "if only" <u>Confusion</u> "Why is this happening? Is God punishing me? Does God love me?"
 - <u>Fear</u> "What will become of me?" <u>Anger</u> "How can they do that to me?"
 - Envy "Why aren't they suffering like I am?" Self-Pity "Won't somebody feel sorry for me?"
 - Hopelessness & Despair "There's nothing I can do, I'm doomed. I'm trapped and will never get out."

B. GOD – **Focus** instead on our Great God

• The "Giving God" • Gives to all • Generously gives • Doesn't begrudge us

C. SIMPLE PRAYER

- 1. Simply Ask
- 2. Ask in FAITH

III. The Problem of Riches and Poverty (vs. 9-11)

A. Economics in light of Eternity (example of handling trials)

- 1. The Rich Poor perspective on ultimate riches/standing in Christ. (4:10; 1 Pt. 5:6)
- 2. The Poor Rich mindful of their constant need of Christ, bend low at feet of cross
- 3. Both face a Transient Life, (life is fleeting) only the Gospel can give hope

B. The Ultimate Test (jumping ahead to vs. 12)

- 1. All of life ultimately is a test passing this test (endurance with faith) gives the crown of life.
- 2. Crown of life is not just an optional reward it is LIFE ETERNAL LIFE Rev. 2:10, 2 Tim. 4:8
- 3. LIFE is won by those who Endure but who also LOVE (Rom. 5:5)
