## Angels and Demons Lesson 1 – Angels

Warning before we proceed Scripture doesn't tell us everything we know or to know.
It tells us what we to know. ( <i>Deuteronomy 29:29</i> )
We ought to limit and focus on what is in Scripture.
What are angels? Spiritual beings that existed the world was created ( <i>Job 38:4-7</i> , cf. <i>Job 1:6</i> , <i>2:1</i> )
The word can refer to both and angels Some angels are elect – 1 Timothy 5:21 Some angels are fallen – Revelation 9:11, 12:7, 9; Matthew 25:41
Such angels are capable of, but not of 2 Peter 2:4, Jude 6
These beings are also called " of God" and ""
Most commonly, the word refers to "elect" angels who carry out God's
Confusingly, in both Hebrew and Greek, the word also means "" or "agent"
Only tells us what is meant, and sometimes it could be either <i>Acts 12:15, Galatians 4:14</i>
Angels are not <i>1 Peter 1:12, Matthew 24:36</i>
Angels are capable of <i>Luke 15:10</i> , <i>Job 38:7</i>
Angels may have a hierarchy - "archangel" ( <i>Jude 9, 1 Thessalonians 4:16</i> ) means " or angel"
Angels "rank" above us ( <i>Psalm 8:4-5</i> ) for now,
but we will one day have over them (1 Corinthians 6:3, Hebrews 2:5)
What do angels look like? They appear in physical form and with the physical world
But they also appear in ( <i>Matthew 1:20; 2:13, 19</i> )
When appearing, they can look like people (see <i>Hebrews 13:2</i> , <i>Genesis 18-19</i> )
Or they can appear so they frighten and awe people ( <i>Luke 1:11-12</i> )
Assigning wings to angels comes from depictions of cherubim and seraphim
cherub ( <i>Genesis 3:24</i> and throughout the temple, especially on the)
seraph ( <i>Isaiah 6:2</i> ) – means "fiery ones"
