## 1. Get Acquainted: Icebreaker

Transactional Relationship: an association based on someone possessing something, not because of who they are but what they have.

Give an example of someone you spent time with to get access to what they had but not because of who they were:

- Tim's example of the joke by Jim Gaffigan, the neighbor kid who had a pool.
- TimO and many of my coaches. I would behave around them and act interested so they might like me and so I could get playing time. Ugh! A very great regret.

## 2. Worship: Great is our Father and Generous in All His Ways

God is generous and we are prone to take many of his amazing gifts for granted. This poem by Robert Service is a beautiful reminder of the wonder of the world God has made and concludes with a sweet invitation to what that means about the One Who Made It All. Spend time praising God.

- ⇒ Confess any weirdness in relationships so that you are ready with a quick apology and a kind word for each person you have the opportunity to enjoy or even bump into.
- ⇒ Praise God for family and friends this Holiday season the ones you see and the ones you can't.
