Confession of Faith

*As an expression of our faith in Jesus Christ in solidarity with his people, we declare the substance of what we believe.
From the Heidelberg Catechism:*

Q. 105. What is God's will for us in the sixth commandment?

A. I am not to belittle, insult, hate, or kill my neighbor not by my thoughts, my words, my look, or gesture and certainly not by actual deeds and I am not to be party to this in others; rather, I am to put away all desire for revenge. I am not to harm or recklessly endanger myself either. Prevention of murder is also why government is armed with the sword.

Q. 106. Does this commandment refer only to murder?

A. God's prohibition of murder teaches us that God hates the root of murder: envy, hatred, anger, vindictiveness. In God's sight all such are hidden murder.

Q. 107. Is it enough then that we not murder our neighbor in any such way?

A. No. By condemning envy, hatred, and anger God wants us to love our neighbors as ourselves, to show patience, peace, gentleness, mercy, and friendliness towards them, to protect them from harm as much as we can, and to do good even to our enemies.

Seasons of the Cross

The color green: a sign of life. In the plant kingdom, growth within an organism extends outward into tender green shoots, culminating in a blossom of life and as a plant goes to seed, multiplying itself over and over again. On the cross, green is a symbol of the ongoing work of Christ in our hearts. Starting with the smallest seed, His work grows in us over our lifetime, shooting tendrils outward into the lives of others as His kingdom grows. Christ's work is ongoing, vibrant and alive in the hearts of His people.

Scripture Passage and Sermon Outline

Proclamation of God's Word

Text: Genesis 6:5-22 (ESV)

Title: Faith In What God Says

Teacher: Tim Rice

⁵ The LORD saw that the wickedness of man was great in the earth, and that every intention of the thoughts of his heart was only evil continually. ⁶ And the LORD regretted that he had made man on the earth, and it grieved him to his heart. ⁷ So the LORD said, "I will blot out man whom I have created from the face of the land, man and animals and creeping things and birds of the heavens, for I am sorry that I have made them." ⁸ But Noah found favor in the eyes of the LORD. ⁹ These are the generations of Noah. Noah was a righteous man, blameless in his generation. Noah walked with God. ¹⁰ And Noah had three sons, Shem, Ham, and Japheth. ¹¹ Now the earth was corrupt in God's sight, and the earth was filled with violence. ¹² And God saw the earth, and behold, it was corrupt, for all flesh had corrupted their way on the earth. ¹³ And God said to Noah, "I have determined to make an end of all flesh, for the earth is filled with violence through them. Behold, I will destroy them with the earth. ¹⁴ Make yourself an ark of gopher wood. Make rooms in the ark, and cover it inside and out with pitch. ¹⁵ This is how you are to make it: the length of the ark 300 cubits, its breadth 50 cubits, and its height 30 cubits. ¹⁶ Make a roof for the ark, and finish it to a cubit above, and set the door of the ark in its side. Make it with lower, second, and third decks. ¹⁷ For behold, I will bring a flood of waters upon the earth to destroy all flesh in which is the breath of life under heaven. Everything that is on the earth shall die. ¹⁸ But I will establish my covenant with you, and you shall come into the ark, you, your sons, your wife, and your sons' wives with you. ¹⁹ And of every living thing of all flesh, you shall bring two of every sort into the ark to keep them alive with you. They shall be male and female. ²⁰ Of the birds according to their kinds, and of the animals according to their kinds, of every creeping thing of the ground, according to its kind, two of every sort shall come in to you to keep them alive. ²¹ Also take with you every sort of food that is eaten, and store it up. It shall serve as food for you and for them." ²² Noah did this; he did all that God commanded him.

Intro: Why this series on faith vs. sight?

GOD IS THERE & HE IS NOT SILENT

How are all these considerations only possible because of God speaking?

WHAT IS WRONG?

How is our generation facing a twin problem over evil *and* a crisis of judgment?

WHAT HOPE DO WE HAVE?

Yet even in the midst of evil, how has the LORD worked to save His people?

YOU CAN PRAY WITH US...

1. Worship the LORD that He is King and Judge of His creation. Praise Him, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, that He has revealed Himself by His Word, and that He not only stops evil but also works to save sinners like us.
2. How have you been naïve about your own corruption, or unwilling to enter into the “ark” of Jesus’ work to save sinners? Confess your pride and unbelief to Jesus, asking Him to forgive you and change your heart.
3. Give thanks to Jesus for His wisdom and kindness. Thank Him that by His wisdom He devised a way for divine justice to be satisfied by His death in your place and to rescue you in the midst of the greatest threat – God’s justice!
4. Who do you know that lives in denial of what God has plainly said? Ask the Lord to open their eyes to realize their true condition before Him, and that He would give you courage to be a herald like Noah was.
5. Ask the Holy Spirit to give you an increased sense of your being rescued by Christ’s work. Ask Him to help you trust the LORD’s word and work to define you in ways that no created thing can.
