Call to Worship

We read God's Word, the Bible, together. It reveals to us who God is and what He expects of us.

1 John 3:11, 13-18 (ESV)

For this is the message that you have heard from the beginning, that we should love one another. ... Do not be surprised, brothers, that the world hates you. We know that we have passed out of death into life, because we love the brothers. Whoever does not love abides in death. Everyone who hates his brother is a murderer, and you know that no murderer has eternal life abiding in him. By this we know love, that he laid down his life for us, and we ought to lay down our lives for the brothers. But if anyone has the world's goods and sees his brother in need, yet closes his heart against him, how does God's love abide in him? Little children, let us not love in word or talk but in deed and in truth.

Prayer of Adoration and Confession – Jason Roland

We pray together praising God for who He really is (Adoration) and admitting our inability to live up to what He expects of us (Confession).

Assurance of Pardon

We again read God's Word together and are reminded that mercy and grace are freely given to all who have faith in Jesus Christ.

1 Peter 1:3-8 (ESV)

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! According to his great mercy, he has caused us to be born again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, to an inheritance that is imperishable, undefiled, and unfading, kept in heaven for you, who by God's power are being guarded through faith for a salvation ready to be revealed in the last time. In this you rejoice, though now for a little while, if necessary, you have been grieved by various trials, so that the tested genuineness of your faith—more precious than gold that perishes though it is tested by fire—may be found to result in praise and glory and honor at the revelation of Jesus Christ. Though you have not seen him, you love him. Though you do not now see him, you believe in him and rejoice with joy that is inexpressible and filled with glory.

Seasons of the Cross

The color green: A sign of life. In the plant kingdom, growth within an organism extends outward into tender green shoots, culminating in a blossom of life and a plant goes to seed, multiplying itself over and over again. On the cross, green is a symbol of the ongoing work of Christ in our hearts. Starting with the smallest seed, His work grows in us over our lifetime, shooting tendrils outward into the lives of others as His kingdom grows. Christ's work is ongoing, vibrant and alive in the hearts of His people.

Intro: Where have you ever sacrificed?

YOU CAN PRAY WITH US ...

1. Worship the LORD that He is worthy of all that we are and all that we have. Praise Him, Father, Son and Holy Spirit that He is most worthy of our love and loyalty.
2. How have you lived withholding your heart from God? Confess your pride and unbelief to Jesus, asking Him to forgive you for your selfishness and to change your heart to see how worthy He truly is.
3. Give thanks to Jesus for giving us life through His sacrifice. Thank Him for 1) securing us in the face of our failures by His death, and 2) healing by His resurrection where we're broken in our rebellion.
4. Who do you know that doubts God's goodness and worth, especially tied to suffering? Pray for them, asking the Lord to help them see God's true authority *and* wisdom to work everything together for our good.
5. Ask the Holy Spirit to bear in you the fruit of joy and love. Pray that He would grow you in your amazement of Jesus' love *for you*, and as a result, you would grow in your joyful love *for Him*.
