Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus, who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. Therefore God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name, so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

The color green: A sign of life. Starting with the smallest seed, His work grows in us over our lifetime, shooting tendrils outward into the lives of others as His kingdom grows. Christ's work is ongoing, vibrant and alive in the hearts of His people.

LOVE DEFINED

Love is putting your happiness in someone else's happiness. Rejoicing when they rejoice.

LOVE THREATENED Envy is being pained by someone else's happiness. Weeping when they rejoice.

LOVE SECURED

God's humility overturns the world.

- 1. Adore God. He is close to the broken-hearted. His heart is soft towards us in all our sadness.
- 2. Confess the ways you insulate your life from he pain of others not weeping when they weep. Also, do you ever resent the successes of others not rejoicing when they rejoice?
- 3. Give thanks for Jesus. His incarnation is an act of cosmos-rearranging humility.
- 4. Ask the spirit to give you the mind of Christ (Phil 2:5).
- 5. Pray for Community Groups that they would become places of empathy and humility.
