Seasons of the Cross

The color green: a sign of life. In the plant kingdom, growth within an organism extends outward into tender green shoots, culminating in a blossom of life and as a plant goes to seed, multiplying itself over and over again. On the cross, green is a symbol of the ongoing work of Christ in our hearts. Starting with the smallest seed, His work grows in us over our lifetime, shooting tendrils outward into the lives of others as His kingdom grows. Christ's work is ongoing, vibrant and alive in the hearts of His people.

Scripture Passage and Sermon Outline

Proclamation of God's Word

Text: Romans 1:8-17 (ESV)

Title: Truly Unashamed

Teacher: Shayne Bass

⁸ First, I thank my God through Jesus Christ for all of you, because your faith is proclaimed in all the world. ⁹ For God is my witness, whom I serve with my spirit in the gospel of his Son, that without ceasing I mention you ¹⁰ always in my prayers, asking that somehow by God's will I may now at last succeed in coming to you. ¹¹ For I long to see you, that I may impart to you some spiritual gift to strengthen you – ¹² that is, that we may be mutually encouraged by each other's faith, both yours and mine. ¹³ I do not want you to be unaware, brothers, that I have often intended to come to you (but thus far have been prevented), in order that I may reap some harvest among you as well as among the rest of the Gentiles. ¹⁴ I am under obligation both to Greeks and to barbarians, both to the wise and to the foolish. ¹⁵ So I am eager to preach the gospel to you also who are in Rome. ¹⁶ For I am not ashamed of the gospel, for it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes, to the Jew first and also to the Greek. ¹⁷ For in it the righteousness of God is revealed from faith for faith, as it is written, "The righteous shall live by faith."

YOU CAN PRAY WITH US...

1. Worship God, Father, Son, and Spirit for His unashamed love for you in the work and truth of the gospel.
2. What point of self-reflection during the discussion of “confession” impacted you most? Confess that to God and ask Him what repentance would look like for you.
3. Give thanks for the influence of those who lived unashamed, gospel-saturated lives, so that you could come to know the grace and peace of the righteousness of God by faith.
4. Pray that God would reveal who should be first on your list of those you need to preach the gospel to. Pray for them. Ask that God would grant you a renewed longing to pray for them “without ceasing” and “always” in your prayer life.
5. Pray for a renewed passion for God’s word and the gospel, and that it would translate into a passionate and shameless pursuit of the people He loves.
