Seasons of the Cross

The color green: A sign of life. In the plant kingdom, growth within an organism extends outward into tender green shoots, culminating in a blossom of life and a plant goes to seed, multiplying itself over and over again. On the cross, green is a symbol of the ongoing work of Christ in our hearts. Starting with the smallest seed, His work grows in us over our lifetime, shooting tendrils outward into the lives of others as His kingdom grows. Christ's work is ongoing, vibrant and alive in the hearts of His people.

Scripture Passage and Sermon Outline

Proclamation of God's Word Text: Romans 14:13-23 (ESV) Title: Love and Conscience Teacher: Tim Rice

¹³ Therefore let us not pass judgment on one another any longer, but rather decide never to put a stumbling block or hindrance in the way of a brother. ¹⁴ I know and am persuaded in the Lord Jesus that nothing is unclean in itself, but it is unclean for anyone who thinks it unclean. ¹⁵ For if your brother is grieved by what you eat, you are no longer walking in love. By what you eat, do not destroy the one for whom Christ died. ¹⁶ So do not let what you regard as good be spoken of as evil. ¹⁷ For the kingdom of God is not a matter of eating and drinking but of righteousness and peace and joy in the Holy Spirit. ¹⁸ Whoever thus serves Christ is acceptable to God and approved by men.¹⁹ So then let us pursue what makes for peace and for mutual upbuilding. ²⁰ Do not, for the sake of food, destroy the work of God. Everything is indeed clean, but it is wrong for anyone to make another stumble by what he eats. ²¹ It is good not to eat meat or drink wine or do anything that causes your brother to stumble. ²² The faith that you have, keep between yourself and God. YOU CAN PRAY WITH US ...

- 3. Give thanks to Jesus for setting down His comforts and preferences to meet our needs, *to save sinners like us*. Thank Him for honoring His Father's will to restore goodness in this world and to make us whole.
- 4. Who do you know that is struggling? Pray for them, asking the Lord to give them a sense of security in His grace (*His* work on their behalf), and ask Him to help you to better know how to encourage them as well.
- 5. Ask the Spirit for wisdom in how to live out the implications of the gospel. Pray for the freedom that you're promised in God's Word *and* at the same time, the love for others that can govern your appetites.
