Call to Worship

The Pharisee, standing by himself, prayed thus: 'God, I thank you that I am not like other men, extortioners, unjust, adulterers, or even like this tax collector. I fast twice a week; I give tithes of all that I get.' But the tax collector, standing far off, would not even lift up his eyes to heaven, but beat his breast, saying, 'God, be merciful to me, a sinner!' I tell you, this man went down to his house justified, rather than the other. For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the one who humbles himself will be exalted."

And so, Lord, uphold us and make us strong with the strength of your Holy Spirit, so that we may not go down to defeat in this spiritual struggle, but may firmly resist our enemies until we finally win the complete victory.

Seasons of the Cross

The color green: a sign of life. In the plant kingdom, growth within an organism extends outward into tender green shoots, culminating in a blossom of life and, as a plant goes to seed, multiplying itself over and over again. On the cross, green is a symbol of the ongoing work of Christ in our hearts. Starting with the smallest seed, His work grows in us over our lifetime, shooting tendrils outward into the lives of others as His kingdom grows. Christ's work is ongoing, vibrant and alive in the hearts of His people.

Scripture Passage and Sermon Outline

Proclamation of God's Word

Text: Romans 3:23-26 (ESV)

Title: God's Satisfaction of Justice

Teacher: Tim Rice

²³ For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, ²⁴ and are justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, ²⁵ whom God put forward as a propitiation by his blood, to be received by faith. This was to show God's righteousness, because in his divine forbearance he had passed over former sins. ²⁶ It was to show his righteousness at the present time, so that he might be just and the justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus.

Intro: How do we get out of consumption and into love?

FALLING SHORT

What does it mean to have fallen short of God's glory? We have fallen short of *Him* our Maker – because *He* is the goal & the standard.

GOD IS MERCIFUL & JUST While it's clear that God is merciful and compassionate, what if He also is righteous and just?	

TRUSTING JESUS YOUR SUBSTITUTE

How does this all become yours personally?

YOU CAN PRAY WITH US...

- 1. Worship the LORD for His goodness and grace. Praise Him, Father, Son and Holy Spirit for His good design for His life-giving power over all existence *and* for creating us in His likeness.
- 2. Consider our sin here in two directions: How have you lived in pride, thinking, "I'm not that bad"? Or how have you lived in fearful unbelief, thinking, "I'm too bad"? Agree with Jesus that you are what He says you are, but also that He is what He says He is, the Savior of sinners.
- 3. Read Luke 18:9-14. Give thanks to Jesus for His work to propitiate your sin both satisfying the just punishment you deserve *and* achieving the righteous standard that the Father made us to fulfill. Thank Him for doing *everything* necessary to save you!
- 4. Who do you know that seems burdened by their guilt? Pray for them, asking the Lord to work joy in their heart and security in the grace of Jesus that the Lord would drive away their fear with His perfect love.
- 5. Ask the Holy Spirit to work into you His hope. Pray that He would help you rest to trust that the work of Jesus is great enough and good enough to overcome whatever would keep you from Him.
