Call to Worship

"Teacher, which is the great commandment in the Law?" And he said to him, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. Seasons of the Cross

The color green: a sign of life. In the plant kingdom, growth within an organism extends outward into tender green shoots, culminating in a blossom of life and, as a plant goes to seed, multiplying itself over and over again. On the cross, green is a symbol of the ongoing work of Christ in our hearts. Starting with the smallest seed, His work grows in us over our lifetime, shooting tendrils outward into the lives of others as His kingdom grows. Christ's work is ongoing, vibrant and alive in the hearts of His people.

Scripture Passage and Sermon Outline

Proclamation of God's Word

Text: Romans 3:22b-31 (ESV)
Title: No Boast, Except in Christ

Teacher: Tim Rice

^{22b} For there is no distinction: ²³ for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, ²⁴ and are justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, ²⁵ whom God put forward as a propitiation by his blood, to be received by faith. This was to show God's righteousness, because in his divine forbearance he had passed over former sins. ²⁶ It was to show his righteousness at the present time, so that he might be just and the justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus. ²⁷ Then what becomes of our boasting? It is excluded. By what kind of law? By a law of works? No, but by the law of faith. ²⁸ For we hold that one is justified by faith apart from works of the law. ²⁹ Or is God the God of Jews only? Is he not the God of Gentiles also? Yes, of Gentiles also, ³⁰ since God is one—who will justify the circumcised by faith and the uncircumcised through faith. ³¹ Do we then overthrow the law by this faith? By no means! On the contrary, we uphold the law.

Intro: Why is humility such a distinctive mark of a true believer?

NO BOASTING

If we're saved by grace (God's work) how does this remove any cause for boasting?

BECAUSE THERE ARE NO WORKS Our standing before God as righteous has NOTHING to do with *anything* we have done. Instead, it rests entirely upon Jesus.

THERE'S NO DISTINCTION

How does being utterly defined by God's Grace change how you live going forward?

YOU CAN PRAY WITH US...

- 1. Worship the LORD for His graciousness. Praise Him, Father, Son and Holy Spirit for His willingness to open His Kingdom, home and family to sinners like us through Christ.
- 2. How have you lived boastfully treasuring what is created more than you value your Maker? Confess your pride and unbelief to Jesus, asking Him to forgive you and to soften your heart to be truly humble.
- 3. Give thanks to Jesus for His gracious work to save us from what we could never remedy or recover. Thank Him for opening up eternity to us not because of how we are, but because of how He is gracious and merciful.
- 4. Who do you know that is prideful or arrogant? Pray for them, asking the Lord to have mercy upon them to make them aware (likely painfully so) of how broken they are and how desperately they need Jesus' Grace.
- 5. Ask the Holy Spirit to work into your heart true humility not that you would think less of yourself, but that you would simply think of yourself less. Read Philippians 3:3-9 and pray that He would fill you with a sense of Jesus' surpassing worth instead.
