Celebrating the Season of Advent - 2016

The earth holds its breath, waiting. Advent is a season of longing, a yearly representation in our church calendar of the ions of time spanning from the moment Eve took the first bite of the apple until that starry night when Heaven touched earth and Christ incarnated, becoming God-man. Fully human. Fully God. Advent culminates in the arrival of Jesus-Messiah in the flesh, born as a human child to the last people on earth who anyone would have chosen to parent a king! In Romans, Paul writes, "For the creation waits with eager longing for the revealing of the sons of God...in hope that the creation itself will be set free from its bondage to corruption and obtain the freedom of the glory of the children of God." Freedom begins with the birth of the Christ. (ref. Rom 8:19, 20b, 21)

Explanation of Advent Theme – Shayne Bass

By the finger of God. Who alone can come against the forces of spiritual darkness in this world and beyond? Only One more powerful than, higher than, and above all created things. Only One who holds the very creative force of the universe in his hands. Amazingly, this One became a little baby, with dirty, fragile, and soft fingers reaching out for the warmth and protection of his mother – showing us just how powerful he is and also showing us the way we too can have this King and his Kingdom. Today we light a candle to reflect on the greatness of God in his creation. In remembering the creation, we also reflect on God's awesome power to save and his ability to use whatever means he chooses to reveal his Holy Love to humanity.

Call to Worship/Lighting of Advent Candle

We read God's Word, the Bible, together. It reveals to us who God is and what He expects of us.

Thus says God, the Lord, who created the heavens and stretched them out, who spread out the earth and what comes from it, who gives breath to the people on it and spirit to those who walk in it: "I am the Lord; I have called you in righteousness; I will take you by the hand and keep you; I will give you as a covenant for the people, a light for the nations, to open the eyes that are blind, to bring out the prisoners from the dungeon, from the prison those who sit in darkness. Fully human. Fully God. Blue has historically been associated with this season, a picture of the darkness before the dawn. In Romans, Paul writes, "For the creation waits with eager longing for the revealing of the sons of God. For the creation was subjected to futility, not willingly, but because of him who subjected it, in hope that the creation itself will be set free from its bondage to corruption and obtain the freedom of the glory of the children of God." (Rom 8:19-21) Freedom begins with the birth of the Christ.

Proclamation of God's Word

Text: Revelation 19:1-6 (ESV)
Title: Sing Hallelujah!
Teacher: Josh Floyd

¹ After this I heard what seemed to be the loud voice of a great multitude in heaven, crying out, "Hallelujah! Salvation and glory and power belong to our God, ² for his judgments are true and just; for he has judged the great prostitute who corrupted the earth with her immorality, and has avenged on her the blood of his servants." ³ Once more they cried out, "Hallelujah! The smoke from her goes up forever and ever." ⁴ And the twenty-four elders and the four living creatures fell down and worshiped God who was seated on the throne, saying, "Amen. Hallelujah!" ⁵ And from the throne came a voice saying, "Praise our God, all you his servants, you who fear him, small and great." ⁶ Then I heard what seemed to be the voice of a great multitude, like the roar of many waters and like the sound of mighty peals of thunder, crying out, "Hallelujah! For the Lord our God the Almighty reigns."

Praise the LORD for His power!

Praise the LORD for His salvation! YOU CAN PRAY WITH US... 1. Worship the LORD for his power and justice displayed by Him executing judgment over his enemies. Praise Him Father, Son and Holy Spirit for His truth, goodness and right rule. 2. Confess to Jesus the ways in which you have lost your sense of awe and wonder at the Lord God Almighty. Confess ways in which we are so easily caught up in and thrown off course by the routine, the busy and the temporary things of this world. 3. Give thanks to God for the salvation of sinners like you and me! Thank Him for rescuing us from the bondage of sin and death through the life, death and resurrection of Jesus (whose birth we celebrate during this Advent season).

4. Who in your life does not know Jesus? Pray for God-ordained conversations to take place between the two of you in this season of Advent. We have the cure for the sickness of sin...and that cure is the gospel of Jesus Christ!

5. Pray that the Holy Spirit would help draw you back to the throne room of God and that we would be quick to sing Hallelujah or Praise the LORD loudly! Pray for boldness and for wisdom in finding the words to say in evangelizing

people whom the Lord has put in your life.
