## Explanation of Advent Theme: Creation - John Tucker

*By the finger of God.* Who alone can come against the forces of spiritual darkness in this world and beyond? Only One more powerful than, higher than and above all created things. Only One who holds the very creative force of the universe in His hands. Amazingly, this One became a little baby, with dirty, fragile and soft fingers reaching out for the warmth and protection of His mother – showing us just how powerful He is and also showing us the way we too can have this King and His Kingdom. Today we light a candle to reflect on the greatness of God in His creation. In remembering the creation, we also reflect on God's awesome power to save and His ability to use whatever means He chooses to reveal His Holy Love to humanity.

## Call to Worship/Lighting of Advent Candle

We read God's Word, the Bible, together. It reveals to us who God is and what He expects of us.

The Springer Family – Isaiah 42:5-9 (ESV)

Thus says God, the LORD, who created the heavens and stretched them out, who spread out the earth and what comes from it, who gives breath to the people on it and spirit to those who walk in it: "I am the LORD; I have called you in righteousness; I will take you by the hand and keep you; I will give you as a covenant for the people, a light for the nations, to open the eyes that are blind, to bring out the prisoners from the dungeon, from the prison those who sit in darkness. I am the LORD; that is my name; my glory I give to no other, nor my praise to carved idols. Behold, the former things have come to pass, and new things I now declare; before they spring forth I tell you of them."

## Prayer of Adoration and Confession - John Tucker

We pray together praising God for who He really is (Adoration) and admitting our inability to live up to what He expects of us (Confession).

## Assurance of Pardon

We read God's Word together and are reminded that mercy and grace are freely given to all who have faith in Jesus Christ.

#### Seasons of the Cross

Midnight blue for Advent: Blue has historically been associated with this season, a picture of the darkness before the dawn. In Romans, Paul writes, "For the creation waits with eager longing for the revealing of the sons of God ... in hope that the creation itself will be set free from its bondage to corruption and obtain the freedom of the glory of the children of God." Freedom begins with the birth of the Christ. (ref. Rom 8:19, 20b, 21)

#### Scripture Passage and Sermon Outline

Proclamation of God's Word

Text: Matthew 1:18-25; 2:1-6 & 13-18 (ESV) Title: The Promise of Christmas: He's Coming! Teacher: Tim Rice

<sup>1:18</sup> Now the birth of Jesus Christ took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been betrothed to Joseph, before they came together she was found to be with child from the Holy Spirit. <sup>19</sup> And her husband Joseph, being a just man and unwilling to put her to shame, resolved to divorce her quietly. <sup>20</sup> But as he considered these things, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, saying, "Joseph, son of David, do not fear to take Mary as your wife, for that which is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. <sup>21</sup> She will bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins." <sup>22</sup> All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had spoken by the prophet: <sup>23</sup> "Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall call his name Immanuel" (which means, God with us). <sup>24</sup> When Joseph woke from sleep, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him: he took his wife, <sup>25</sup> but knew her not until she had given birth to a son. And he called his name Jesus. <sup>2:1</sup> Now after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea in the days of Herod the king, behold, wise men from the east came to Jerusalem, <sup>2</sup> saying, "Where is he who has been born king of the Jews? For we saw his star when it rose and have come to worship him." <sup>3</sup> When Herod the king heard this, he was troubled, and all Jerusalem with him; <sup>4</sup> and assembling all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Christ was to be born. <sup>5</sup> They told him, "In Bethlehem of Judea, for so it is written by the prophet: 6 "And you, O Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for from you shall come a ruler who will shepherd my people Israel." ... 13 Now when they had departed, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream and said, "Rise, take the child and his mother, and flee to Egypt, and remain there until I tell you, for Herod is about to search for the child, to destroy him." <sup>14</sup> And he rose and took the child and his mother by night and departed to Egypt <sup>15</sup> and remained there until the death of Herod. This was to fulfill what the Lord had spoken by the prophet, "Out of Egypt I called my son." <sup>16</sup> Then Herod, when he saw that he had been tricked by the wise men, became furious, and he sent and killed all the male children in Bethlehem and in all that region who were two years old or under, according to the time that he had ascertained from the wise men. <sup>17</sup> Then was fulfilled what was spoken by the prophet Jeremiah: 18 "A voice was heard in Ramah, weeping and loud lamentation, Rachel weeping for her children; she refused to be comforted, because they are no more."

Intro: When have you seen a long-held promise kept? (e.g. Narnia)

#### SCANDAL & MIRACLE

This story tells of a scandal (sin) and a miracle (salvation) in the midst of a *national* scandal in desperate need of a miracle ...

#### HOW IS THE PROBLEM DEFINED?

People may debate whether or not they believe the Bible, but clearly it tells the story of Creation, Sin & Redemption. What resolutely will not help?

#### THE HOLY CHILD

Why do we believe that Jesus is special - that He is holy?

#### YOU CAN PRAY WITH US ...

- 1. Worship the LORD for His love, power and wisdom. Praise Him, Father, Son and Holy Spirit for how He has worked even through shame, loss, suffering and death in order to redeem sinners like us.
- 2. How have you lived denying either that you are a scandal (*in sin*) or that there are miracles (*because you can solve your own problems*)? Confess your pride and unbelief to Jesus, asking Him to forgive you and change you.
- 3. Give thanks to Jesus for how He has worked to save us. Thank Him for becoming a scandal in our place, which IS a miracle that God would work so radically to save us when He could justly destroy us.
- 4. Who do you know that struggles with minimizing their sin or need for a Savior? Ask the Lord to help them, to open their eyes to their true peril without Jesus and to use you to help them find hope in Christ.
- 5. Ask the Holy Spirit to bear in you the fruit of patience. Pray for the wisdom to think well about Jesus' promise to return in light of His promises kept at His first coming, and that the Spirit would sustain you in hope.
