Celebrating the Season of Advent - 2017

The earth holds its breath, waiting. Advent is a season of longing, a yearly representation in our church calendar of the eons of time spanning from the moment Eve took the first bite of the fruit until that starry night when Heaven touched earth and Christ incarnated, becoming God-man. Fully human. Fully God. Advent culminates in the arrival of Jesus-Messiah in the flesh, born as a human child to the last people on earth who anyone would have chosen to parent a king!

Song of Gathering and Preparation

Explanation of Advent Theme: Promise – Dan Anthony

For yours is the kingdom of God. Poverty is everywhere; hunger, loss, fear and childlessness are not just the stuff of a few unfortunate people. The story of Christmas, really the story of the whole Bible, invites us to embrace our own hopeless poverty, like Abraham and Sarah – too old for a promised son – and to believe that the Kingdom belongs to those who know they don't belong. On this second Sunday of Advent, we light a candle to remember the promise of God to make a people for himself through a special Son. Barren old women, murderers, thieves, and outcasts, the lost and the lonely, the gluttons and the greedy, these are invited to bow before the baby King and rejoice.

Call to Worship/Lighting of Advent Candle

We read God's Word, the Bible, together. It reveals to us who God is and what He expects of us.

The Jones Family – John 1:1-5, 9-14 (ESV)

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things were made through him, and without him was not any thing made that was made. In him was life, and the life was the light of men. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it...The true light, which gives light to everyone, was coming into the world. He was in the world, and the world was made through him, yet the world did not know him. He came to his own, and his own people did not receive him. But to all who did receive him, who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God, who were born, not of blood nor of the will of the flesh nor of the will of man, but of God. And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth.

Prayer of Adoration and Confession - Dan Anthony

We pray together praising God for who He really is (Adoration) and admitting our inability to live up to what He expects of us (Confession).

Assurance of Pardon

We again read God's Word together and are reminded that mercy and grace are freely given to all who have faith in Jesus Christ. 2 Corinthians 4:7, 13-16 (ESV)

But we have this treasure in jars of clay, to show that the surpassing power belongs to God and not to us...

Since we have the same spirit of faith according to what has been written, "I believed, and so I spoke," we also believe, and so we also speak, knowing that he who raised the Lord Jesus will raise us also with Jesus and bring us with you into his presence. For it is all for your sake, so that as grace extends to more and more people it may increase thanksgiving, to the glory of God. So we do not lose heart. Though our outer self is wasting away, our inner self his being renewed day by day.

Seasons of the Cross

Blue for Advent: Blue has historically been associated with this season, a picture of the darkness before the dawn. In Romans, Paul writes, "For the creation waits with eager longing for the revealing of the sons of God...in hope that the creation itself will be set free from its bondage to corruption and obtain the freedom of the glory of the children of God." Freedom begins with the birth of the Christ. (ref. Rom 8:19, 20b, 21)

Scripture Passage and Sermon Outline

Proclamation of God's Word

Text: Luke 1:67b-79 (ESV)

Title: Joy Because of Deliverance

Teacher: Tim Rice

67b Zechariah was filled with the Holy Spirit and prophesied, saying, 68 "Blessed be the Lord God of Israel, for he has visited and redeemed his people 69 and has raised up a horn of salvation for us in the house of his servant David, 70 as he spoke by the mouth of his holy prophets from of old, 71 that we should be saved from our enemies and from the hand of all who hate us; 72 to show the mercy promised to our fathers and to remember his holy covenant, 73 the oath that he swore to our father Abraham, to grant us 74 that we, being delivered from the hand of our enemies, might serve him without fear, 75 in holiness and righteousness before him all our days. 76 And you, child, will be called the prophet of the Most High; for you will go before the Lord to prepare his ways, 77 to give knowledge of salvation to his people in the forgiveness of their sins, 78 because of the tender mercy of our God, whereby the sunrise shall visit us from on high 79 to give light to those who sit in darkness and in the shadow of death, to guide our feet into the way of peace."

Intro: Who is the most joyful person you know?

IT'S BEEN A LONG TIME...

What does it mean to yearn for change (deliverance)?

BUT GOD HAS COME TO REDEEM While deliverance first implies captivity, the miracle of the Gospel is that God gives us deliverance.

AND HE HAS REDEEMED ME!

What changes when this becomes yours?

YOU CAN PRAY WITH US...

- 1. Worship the LORD for His mercy as our Deliverer. Praise Him, Father, Son and Holy Spirit for His work to visit us in Christ to forgive and transform us by His love.
- 2. How have you lived in cynicism and unbelief as the LORD disappoints your expectations? Confess your pride to Jesus, asking Him to forgive you and soften your heart to see His wisdom and grace.
- 3. Give thanks to Jesus for His coming! Thank Him for leaving heaven to come bear our guilt, for allowing His life to be extinguished to save us, and for rejoicing over us in His resurrection power.
- 4. Who do you know that struggles with cynicism unbelief in any real hope? Pray for them, asking the Lord to work humility and hope into their heart.
- 5. Ask the Holy Spirit to bear in you the fruit of joy. Pray that He would help you to know Jesus' victory over *everything* terrible and that He would take you from silence to speaking up about Him, from cynicism to song.
