Celebrating the Season of Advent - 2016

The earth holds its breath, waiting. Advent is a season of longing, a yearly representation in our church calendar of the eons of time spanning from the moment Eve took the first bite of the apple until that starry night when Heaven touched earth and Christ incarnated, becoming God-man. Fully human. Fully God. Advent culminates in the arrival of Jesus – Messiah in the flesh, born as a human child to the last people on earth who anyone would have chosen to parent a king! In Romans, Paul writes, "For the creation waits with eager longing for the revealing of the sons of God...in hope that the creation itself will be set free from its bondage to corruption and obtain the freedom of the glory of the children of God." Freedom begins with the birth of the Christ. (ref. Rom 8:19, 20b, 21)

Explanation of Advent Theme - Stan McMahan

The kingdom of God is in the midst of you. Those in Bethlehem and beyond failed to note the significance of his arrival – his advent, of the star in the east or the strange clamor of the shepherds that night – wandering and rejoicing through the streets. One who did take note wanted to kill him. Even so, God has given us clear instruction on how we ought to live and wait for his great day. On this third Sunday of Advent, we light a candle to honor the law of God. In the law, the Father shows us the beauty of his Kingdom in our midst – his heart of righteousness and his holy authority to rule. The Word made flesh, God's law wrapped in swaddling clothes and lying in a manger, comes that we too might live and pray "Thy Kingdom come; thy will be done."

Call to Worship/Lighting of Advent Candle

We read God's Word, the Bible, together. It reveals to us who God is and what He expects of us.

The Ellerbe Family – Isaiah 65:17-19, 25 (ESV)

"For behold, I create new heavens and a new earth, and the former things shall not be remembered or come into mind. But be glad and rejoice forever in that which I create; for behold, I create Jerusalem to be a joy, and her people to be a gladness. I will rejoice in Jerusalem and be glad in my people; no more shall be heard in it the sound of weeping and the cry of distress...The wolf and the lamb shall graze together; the lion shall eat straw like the ox, and dust shall be the serpent's food. They shall not hurt or destroy in all my holy mountain," says the Lord.

For the creation was subjected to futility, not willingly, but because of him who subjected it, in hope that the creation itself will be set free from its bondage to corruption and obtain the freedom of the glory of the children of God." (Rom 8:19-21) Freedom begins with the birth of the Christ.

Title: Dwelling With God

¹ Then I saw a new heaven and a new earth, for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away, and the sea was no more. ² And I saw the holy city, new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared as a bride adorned for her husband. ³ And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, "Behold, the dwelling place of God is with man. He will dwell with them, and they will be his people, and God himself will be with them as their God. ⁴ He will wipe away every tear from their eyes, and death shall be no more, neither shall there be mourning, nor crying, nor pain anymore, for the former things have passed away." ⁵ And he who was seated on the throne said, "Behold, I am making all things new." Also he said, "Write this down, for these words are trustworthy and true." ⁶ And he said to me, "It is done! I am the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end. RESTORED & RECONCILED How does Jesus make it possible for us to be in God's holy presence and to be unharmed? YOU CAN PRAY WITH US... 1. Worship the LORD that He is loving and eager to be with His people. Praise Him, Father, Son and Holy Spirit for His Presence and His grace to prepare a place for all who trust in Him that where He is we could be also. 2. How have you lived as if your sins are not that harmful, as if you haven't caused any tears, pain or (spiritual) death? Confess your pride and numbness to Jesus asking Him to forgive you and to restore you. 3. Give thanks to Jesus for atoning for your sin by His death in your place. Thank Him for making it possible for the curtain of separation to be torn away so that you could be reconciled to God and welcomed into His Presence. 4. Who do you know that you would love to see reconciled to God? Ask the Lord to help them to see their need for Jesus, and to help you share your faith in a clear and helpful way. 5. Ask the Holy Spirit to bear in you the fruit of patience while you wait for Jesus to return. Pray that the Spirit would

help you to live securely - by His Presence in you - until you get to see Jesus face-to-face.
