Seasons of the Cross

Black for Lent: The weeks from Ash Wednesday leading up to Palm Sunday on the church calendar have historically been set aside as a time to reflect and ponder the crushing weight of our sin, which is inescapable but for Christ. Black for mourning – a representation of our imminent spiritual and physical death apart from Christ. How wonderful, how marvelous that though our sin was great, His grace was greater – and the story does not end there.

“For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.” Romans 6:23 (ESV)

Scripture Passage and Sermon Outline

Proclamation of God's Word

Text: Romans 5:15-21 (ESV)

Title: Union With Christ

Teacher: Tim Rice

¹⁵ But the free gift is not like the trespass. For if many died through one man's trespass, much more have the grace of God and the free gift by the grace of that one man Jesus Christ abounded for many. ¹⁶ And the free gift is not like the result of that one man's sin. For the judgment following one trespass brought condemnation, but the free gift following many trespasses brought justification. ¹⁷ For if, because of one man's trespass, death reigned through that one man, much more will those who receive the abundance of grace and the free gift of righteousness reign in life through the one man Jesus Christ. ¹⁸ Therefore, as one trespass led to condemnation for all men, so one act of righteousness leads to justification and life for all men. ¹⁹ For as by the one man's disobedience the many were made sinners, so by the one man's obedience the many will be made righteous. ²⁰ Now the law came in to increase the trespass, but where sin increased, grace abounded all the more, ²¹ so that, as sin reigned in death, grace also might reign through righteousness leading to eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord.

YOU CAN PRAY WITH US...

1. Worship the LORD, God Almighty for His power over sin and death that He has proven in Christ.
Praise Him, Father, Son and Holy Spirit that He loves us enough to come save us from every threat or peril.
2. How have you lived in rebellion, like Adam, *fighting God's boundaries and seeking to be a law unto yourself?* Confess your pride to Jesus, asking Him to forgive you, to cleanse you, and *to give you a new heart in union with Him.*
3. Give thanks to Jesus for the unheard of gift of taking your failures to guarantee that you enjoy His successes.
Thank Him for removing your guilt and for keeping the Father's design to free you to be whole and obedient.
4. Who do you know that is insecure? Ask the Father to give them a sense of security *through being united with Christ.* Ask for what Romans 5 promises – no condemnation, righteousness, and eternal life.
5. Where are you fearful? Ask the Holy Spirit to bear in you the fruit of joy at Jesus' triumph over sin and death.
Ask Him to convince you that if He can defeat these ultimate threats, then surely He can help you to not fear what threatens you.
