Seasons of the Cross

Black for Lent: The weeks from Ash Wednesday leading up to Palm Sunday on the church calendar have historically been set aside as a time to reflect and ponder the crushing weight of our sin, which is inescapable but for Christ. Black for mourning – a representation of our imminent spiritual and physical death apart from Christ. How wonderful, how marvelous that though our sin was great, His grace was greater – and the story does not end there.

"For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord." Romans 6:23 (ESV)

Scripture Passage and Sermon Outline

Proclamation of God's Word

Text: Romans 6:1-11 (ESV)

Title: Dead to Sin & Alive to God

Teacher: Tim Rice

¹ What shall we say then? Are we to continue in sin that grace may abound? ² By no means! How can we who died to sin still live in it? ³ Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into His death? ⁴ We were buried therefore with Him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life. ⁵ For if we have been united with Him in a death like His, we shall certainly be united with Him in a resurrection like His. ⁶ We know that our old self was crucified with Him in order that the body of sin might be brought to nothing, so that we would no longer be enslaved to sin. ⁷ For one who has died has been set free from sin. ⁸ Now if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with Him. ⁹ We know that Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die again; death no longer has dominion over Him. ¹⁰ For the death He died He died to sin, once for all, but the life He lives He lives to God. ¹¹ So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus.

Intro: Indispensable to every structure is a foundation (the unseen necessity).

SIN THAT REQUIRES DEATH

Why is it necessary to die in sin?

HOW WELL CAN YOU COUNT? What exactly are we commanded to do (the first command in the entire book of Romans)? YOU CAN PRAY WITH US... 1. Worship the LORD, God Almighty, for His power and goodness. Praise Him, Father, Son and Holy Spirit for His victory over sin and death in Christ, and sealed to us by His Spirit. 2. How have you lived as if sin is a plaything or like a bad habit, rather than as destructive slavery, or defiance of God in His holiness? Confess your pride and unbelief to Jesus, asking Him to forgive you and to change your heart. 3. Give thanks to Jesus for His victory as our 2nd Adam. Thank Him (again) for His active and passive obedience - His death for our guilt, and His success in fulfilling the Father's original design for us. 4. Who do you know that is spiritually dead? Ask the Lord to give them life by His Spirit that they would experience His enduring love instead of hoping in the temporary pleasures of this world. 5. Ask the Spirit to empower you by Jesus' record implanted in your heart. Pray that He would help you die to sin and

that He would enliven you with love and affection for the Father.

HOPE BY RESURRECTION
