Call to Worship

We read God's Word, the Bible, together. It reveals to us who God is and what He expects of us.

2 Corinthians 4:1-4 (ESV)

Therefore, having this ministry by the mercy of God, we do not lose heart. But we have renounced disgraceful, underhanded ways. We refuse to practice cunning or to tamper with God's word, but by the open statement of the truth we would commend ourselves to everyone's conscience in the sight of God. And even if our gospel is veiled, it is veiled to those who are perishing. In their case the god of this world has blinded the minds of the unbelievers, to keep them from seeing the light of the gospel of the glory of Christ, who is the image of God.

Prayer of Adoration and Confession – Dan Anthony

We pray together praising God for who He really is (Adoration) and admitting our inability to live up to what He expects of us (Confession).

Assurance of Pardon

We read God's Word together and are reminded that mercy and grace are freely given to all who have faith in Jesus Christ.

2 Corinthians 4:5-7, 16-18 (ESV)

For what we proclaim is not ourselves, but Jesus Christ as Lord, with ourselves as your servants for Jesus' sake. For God, who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ. But we have this treasure in jars of clay, to show that the surpassing power belongs to God and not to us. ... So we do not lose heart. Though our outer self is wasting away, our inner self is being renewed day by day. For this light momentary affliction is preparing for us an eternal weight of glory beyond all comparison, as we look not to the things that are seen but to the things that are unseen. For the things that are seen are transient, but the things that are unseen are eternal.

Seasons of the Cross

Black for Lent: The weeks from Ash Wednesday leading up to Palm Sunday have historically been set aside as a time to reflect and ponder the crushing weight of our sin, which is inescapable but for Christ. (Black is for mourning – a representation of our imminent spiritual and physical death apart from Christ.) How wonderful, how marvelous that though our sin was great, His grace was greater—and the story does not end there. “For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.” Rom 6:23

Scripture Passage and Sermon Outline

Proclamation of God's Word

Text: Exodus 33:1-4, 12-23 (ESV)

Title: Show Me Your Glory

Teacher: Tim Rice

¹ The LORD said to Moses, "Depart; go up from here, you and the people whom you have brought up out of the land of Egypt, to the land of which I swore to Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, saying, 'To your offspring I will give it.' ² I will send an angel before you, and I will drive out the Canaanites, the Amorites, the Hittites, the Perizzites, the Hivites, and the Jebusites. ³ Go up to a land flowing with milk and honey; but I will not go up among you, lest I consume you on the way, for you are a stiff-necked people." ⁴ When the people heard this disastrous word, they mourned, and no one put on his ornaments. ... ¹² Moses said to the LORD, "See, you say to me, 'Bring up this people,' but you have not let me know whom you will send with me. Yet you have said, 'I know you by name, and you have also found favor in my sight.' ¹³ Now therefore, if I have found favor in your sight, please show me now your ways, that I may know you in order to find favor in your sight. Consider too that this nation is your people." ¹⁴ And he said, "My presence will go with you, and I will give you rest." ¹⁵ And he said to him, "If your presence will not go with me, do not bring us up from here. ¹⁶ For how shall it be known that I have found favor in your sight, I and your people? Is it not in your going with us, so that we are distinct, I and your people, from every other people on the face of the earth?" ¹⁷ And the LORD said to Moses, "This very thing that you have spoken I will do, for you have found favor in my sight, and I know you by name." ¹⁸ Moses said, "Please show me your glory." ¹⁹ And he said, "I will make all my goodness pass before you and will proclaim before you my name 'The LORD.' And I will be gracious to whom I will be gracious, and will show mercy on whom I will show mercy. ²⁰ But," he said, "you cannot see my face, for man shall not see me and live." ²¹ And the LORD said, "Behold, there is a place by me where you shall stand on the rock, ²² and while my glory passes by I will put you in a cleft of the rock, and I will cover you with my hand until I have passed by. ²³ Then I will take away my hand, and you shall see my back, but my face shall not be seen."

Intro: What is the significance of someone's presence?

“WE HAVE A PROBLEM ...”

What is the problem in this story?

A HUMBLE, GODLY PRAYER

What is distinctive about how Moses responds?

A MERCIFUL, MIRACULOUS RESPONSE

What if the one thing you think you need would kill you if you got it?

YOU CAN PRAY WITH US ...

1. Worship the LORD for His holiness and glory. Praise Him, Father, Son and Holy Spirit for His surpassing worth – immeasurably greater than any created person, experience or thing.
2. How have you lived without seeking the LORD, being satisfied with “a great life” even if Jesus is nowhere in the picture? Confess your unbelief to Jesus, asking Him to forgive you and to be your true Treasure.
3. Give thanks to Jesus for how He has worked to cover us from being destroyed by the LORD’s holiness! Thank Him for bearing your sins in His own death, and for covering you with His holiness and love.
4. Who do you know that is stiff-necked and proud (and it may be you)? Pray for them, asking the Lord to have mercy upon them and to soften their heart to see their need for Christ and to see His glory and grace.
5. Ask the Holy Spirit to work in you a trust in and hunger for God’s glory – especially His glory in the Gospel. Read 2 Corinthians 4:5-7, 16-18 and pray that “the eternal weight” of God’s glory would anchor you!
